

PREFACE

This third revision of the <u>Selected Bibliography of Regional</u>

<u>Medical Programs</u> has been prepared by the Office of Communications

and Public Information of the Regional Medical Programs Service from

listings submitted by the Regional Medical Programs. It incorporates

a number of new publications dealing with Regional Medical Program

activities, but, as the title indicates, only selected materials

are listed.

Because of space limitations, no newspaper articles, with the exception of selected trade publication articles, are included in this edition. Some format changes have been made, and a simple index has been added to facilitate searches for particular subject matter materials.

The index does not attempt to catalogue all listed publications.

For example, general information materials on an RMP are not indexed.

In many cases, the subject matter of a publication had to be determined from title alone, since the actual publication was not available, and this will be reflected in the indexing.

We regret these limitations, but trust the Bibliography will be of value to the individual Regions and to those groups and organizations who are interested in the work of the Regional Medical Programs.
