

The Virginia Native Plant Society (VNPS) is a non-profit organization that promotes conservation and protection of native plants and natural habitats. We strive to discourage people from planting alien/exotic plants that are known to be invasive throughout the mid-Atlantic region while encouraging the use of regional native plants in the landscape. As a conservation organization, we are concerned about native plant species being collected in the wild. We educate gardeners about this concern and ask them to avoid purchasing wild-collected plants. One way we achieve this is by supplying gardeners with a list of vendors who specialize in nursery-propagated native plants and/or responsibly collected seeds. The VNPS also strives to protect a plant species as a whole by preserving genetic variation found in local varieties. We are concerned that local native plant varieties could become genetically diluted by planting non-local varieties.
