The historical sketch represents my personal outline of events that I believe are significant for your consideration of applications submitted from RMPs, both the ones you are now reviewing and the ones to be review in July.

The remarkable features of this chain of events is that you and 22 other consultants have agreed to participate in the review; that 53 RMP staffs, RAGs and technical review bodies and CHP agencies have participated in the development of applications; and that a small nucleus of present and past DRMP staff are still on hand to analyze the applications. One final note of good fortune is that the National Advisory Council in June will be at almost full strength; of the 19 members, 11 represent individuals who have been members of the Council or Review Committee, and 3 more represent individuals who have been involved with local RMPs.

The basic plan for review, whether you serve as an individual consultant or act as a Committee, is to have two separate panels with one group reviewing the 28 applications from the South Central and Mid-Continent areas and the other group reviewing the 25 applications, including California, from the Eastern and Western areas. The applications enclosed in this package are assigned to you for review.

A draft agenda for the May 22, 23 and 24 meeting and a review guide for your use in studying the applications will be mailed in a few days.

HISTORICAL SKETCH--DRMP - RMPs

Situation from June 1973 to Present

HEADQUARTERS--DRMP-RMPS

Herbert B. Pahl, Ph.D. Acting Director

Cleveland R. Chambliss Acting Deputy Director Services as Director in Dr. Pahl's absence

RMPS placed organizationally in Bureau of Health Services Research, Health Resources Administration July 1973 - January 1974

RMPS (renamed DRMP) transferred functionally to Bureau of Health Resources Development in January 1974

DRMP, CHP, Hill-Burton placed organizationally under Acting Associate Director for Health Resources Planning--Mr. Eugene Rubel, who also heads CHP

DRMP staff reduced from 250 in FY 1973 to 129 in FY 1973. Present staff now 88.

March 1974: Proposed decentralization of headquarters functions to ten DHEW Regional Office. No effective date announ announced as yet.

THE FIELD--RMPs

56 RMPs reduced to 53, with Northeast Ohio, Ohio and Delaware Valley phased out.

Sept. 1: Emergency FY 1974 funds awarded to eight RMPs originally slated for phase-out before Sept. 1973.

Sept. 7: RMPs notified to submit two applications in five option areas for FY funds on Oct. 1 and Nov. 1.

Sept.: RMPs sue Government.

Oct. 1: \$17.1M now obligated from FY 1974 funds to 53 RMPs.

Nov. 1973: Council reviewed applications from 53 RMPs for \$24.1M to maintain programs from Jan.-June 1974. Option restrictions lifted.

Dec. 1973: Staff reviews requests for carryover from Oct. 1 awards.

Jan. 1974: Awards to 53 RMPs for period Jan.-June 1974.

Feb. 7: Court decision rendered that Government should release FY 1973 and FY 1974 funds to 53 RMPs.

March: DRMP rescinds all phase-out instructions including restrictions on previously awarded funds. Period extended to June 1975 for all RMPs.

March: RMPs advised of two submission dates for applications--May 1 & July 1; RMPs reminded of importance of CHP review and comment, and need for involvement in health resources development.

HISTORICAL SKETCH--DRMP - RMPs

Situation As Of May 6, 1974

HEADQUARTERS--DRMP (RMPS)

About \$109M available for awards-July 1, 1974 and Sept. 1, 1974. \$4.2M earmarked for arthritis with separate applications and separate review.

No restrictions other than those related to existing policy and new legislation (i.e., EMS and HMO); encouragement to develop program activities geared toward needs represented by proposed legislation for health resources planning.

THE FIELD--RMPs

53 applications submitted on May 1; requests total approximately \$114M. Ohio projects included in Western Pennsylvania and Ohio Valley applications.

7 RMPs request only continuation funding, will apply for funds to initiate new activities in July.

7 RMPs request funds for entire program needs for next year; will not request additional funds in July.

39 RMPs request combination of funds for continuation of staff, projects, and new activities.

46 RMPs will submit applications in July for funds for new activities.
