George Washington's Mount Vernon Estate and Gardens is accepting applications from qualified college students for the George Washington Pioneer Farmer Internship Program. Interns accepted into the program will work at the George Washington Pioneer Farmer site, an 18th-century working farm located on the grounds of historic Mount Vernon, 16 miles south of Washington, DC. Interns serve as part of an interpretive team that includes members of the Historic Trades and Livestock staffs.

As part of Mount Vernon's interpretive program, selected applicants will wear period clothing and work on-site at the Pioneer Farm to teach visitors about George Washington's role as an innovative agriculturist and entrepreneur. Selected interns will work under the direction of Mount Vernon's lead interpreters and will conduct a variety of hands-on activities and demonstrations for visitors. Interns also will assist with daily site interpretation.

Mount Vernon will select up to four undergraduate students (ages 18-22) for the internship program. Applicants must have completed at least one year of college before the start of the internship. Candidates should have a strong interest in history, agriculture, teaching and/or museum studies, have strong public speaking skills, and be comfortable around livestock. All interns are required to complete a short training program focusing on interpretation, obtain and demonstrate content knowledge, demonstrate the ability to work with the visiting public, and complete a short research project. All interns are required to participate in several scheduled field trips to selected historic sites and museums. The George Washington Pioneer Farmer Internship period is ten weeks, from June 1, 2009 to August 7, 2009. Selected interns will receive round-trip travel to Washington, DC, a weekly stipend of \$200 (pre-tax), and will be housed in quarters on the Mount Vernon estate.

The non-profit association provides a national resource for education about George Washington and currently welcomes over one million visitors a year to his 18th-century plantation home. 
