Within 60 calendar days of receipt, and after the appropriate science discipline has completed their evaluation, you will be notified of their conclusions. Due to the scope of your request, it may take longer than 60 calendar days to review and prepare all conclusions. If this becomes the case we will notify you. Once you are notified of the conclusions, there is an appeal process available to you if you are dissatisfied with the decisions regarding your inquiry.
