
Wild Rogue River Noncommercial Off-season Use Permit

Conditions of Use

- Your signature as party leader affirms that the following conditions for a noncommercial permit have been met:
 - There is a bona fide sharing of expenses.
 - b. There are no fees collected in excess of the actual cost of the trip.
 - c. There is no financial gain by any member of the group.
 - d. No salary is directed from shared expenses of the trip.
 - No charge is collected for use of the equipment.
- 2. All unburnable garbage and fire residue (ashes, charcoal) must be hauled out.
- Use of motors for propelling boats is only allowed from November 16 through May 14 between Grave Creek and Blossom Bar. Use of motors between Blossom Bar and Watson Creek requires a US Forest Service motorboat permit. An Oregon State Marine Board Motorboat permit with registration number must be displayed on motorized craft.
- A Coast Guard approved personal flotation device must be readily accessible, properly fit, and in good condition, for each member of the party.
- This permit is valid for 1 launch of 1 trip which may not exceed 7 days including the launch date.
- "I agree that by accepting this permit I may be liable for all expenses incurred by a public or authorized private entity for emergency services rendered me while on the Rogue River."
- 7. Party leader must accompany the group on the entire river trip.
- All open fires within 400 feet of the river must be contained in a firepan. A fire ring may not be built, and an existing fire ring may not be used.
- 9. Disturbing, removing, or damaging any natural feature or artifact is prohibited.
- Campsites are available on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 11. The party leader must be at least 18 years of age.
- 12. Scavenged wood must be both dead and down.
- 13. Carry a bagless, waterproof portable toilet for removing all solid human waste and toilet paper from the river canyon. The toilet system must be large enough to accommodate the entire group for the complete length of the trip and must be made available for use by all party members. The toilet must be used when stopping for any reason at a location without a government-provided toilet.
