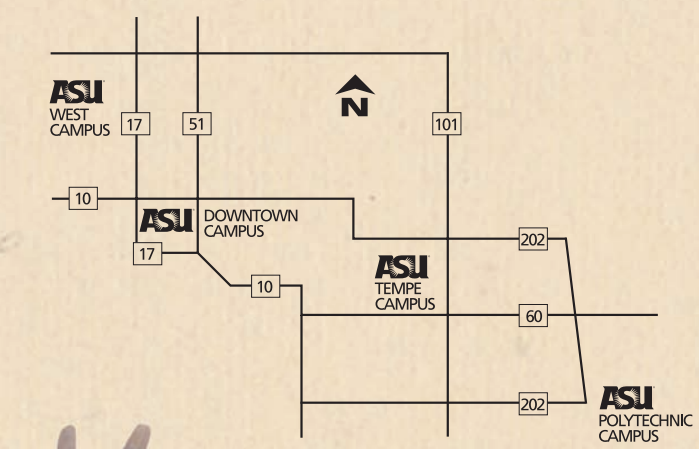
Visitor Parking
