

SPECIAL RESTRICTION – OPEN FIRE PROHIBITION
BLACK HILLS NATIONAL FOREST
WITHIN STATE OF WYOMING

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area, roads, and trails of the Black Hills National Forest within the State of Wyoming until further notice:

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a campfire, charcoal broiler, or a coal or wood stove without a permit except in a Forest Service designated developed campground, picnic ground, or in an area posted by a Forest Officer authorizing fires within that area. 36 CFR 261.52(a)

Permits are not required for use of petroleum fueled stoves, lanterns, or heating devices, provided such devices meet the fire underwriters specifications for safety.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Persons with a permit that was issued after the date of this order specifically authorizing the prohibited act or mission.
2. Forest Service personnel engaged in the performance of an official duty.
