

Fire Regulations

Rocky Mountain Region

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50a, each of the following is prohibited on each National Forest or National Grassland in the Rocky Mountain Region:



1. Possessing, discharging or using any kind of firework or pyrotechnic device. 36 CFR 261.52(f)
2. Operating or using any internal or external combustion engine without a spark arresting device properly installed, maintained and in effective working order, meeting either: (1) Department of Agriculture, Forest Service Standard 5100-1a; or (2) Appropriate Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) recommended practice J335(b) and J350(a). 36 CFR 261.52(j)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempted from this order:

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

The "Spark Arrestor Guide" is available for viewing at the Forest Supervisor Offices and District Ranger Offices. Power saws and other multi-position exhaust systems may require bumper spikes, handlebars, or other devices to qualify the spark arrestor.
