

SPECIAL RESTRICTION - OPEN FIRE PROHIBITION  
BLACK HILLS NATIONAL FOREST  
WITHIN STATE OF WYOMING

Pursuant to 16 U.S.C. 551, and 36 CFR, Sec 261.50(a), the following acts are prohibited on all National Forest System lands administered by the Black Hills National Forest within the State of Wyoming (the "Restricted Area"). The Restricted Area is depicted on the attached map, hereby incorporated into this Order as Exhibit A. This Order shall be in effect until rescinded or until December 31, 2007, whichever occurs first.

**PROHIBITIONS:**

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or a stove fire, except in a Forest Service designated and developed campground or picnic ground 36 CFR 261.52(a)
  - Stove fires include coal, charcoal and wood fires.
  - Petroleum fueled stoves, lanterns, or heating devices may be used, provided such devices meet the fire underwriter's specifications for safety.

**EXEMPTIONS:**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e) the following persons are exempt from this order:

- Persons with a Forest Service permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.

Violation of this prohibition is punishable as a Class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual, or \$10,000.00 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both.
