HORTICULTURAL RESEARCH INSTITUTE Progress Through Industry Supported Research



Since 1963, the Horticultural Research Institute has directed more than \$4 million of industry funds to some 600-research projects covering the full range of production, environmental and business issues important to the trade.

The HRI Endowment Fund is the primary source of project funding. Created in 1975 as HRI's philanthropic arm, the endowment fund now stands at over \$8.2 million committed by 160 individuals, associations and corporations. The HRI Endowment Fund's principal remains invested and untouched; only the interest is tapped to fund research.

The HRI Executive Committee considered more than 100 applications for funding and granted \$335,000 to 22 high-priority projects and four scholarships. The committee determined these projects best meet the needs of the industry and have quality scientific merit that will result in new knowledge and techniques to deal with major industry issues.

HRI is actively partnering with other associations to increase industry research. Most notably HRI has partnered with the USDA Agricultural Research Service to obtain and guide federal research dollars to critical industry research through the Floriculture and Nursery Research Initiative (FNRI). FNRI research funding now totals \$6.25 million. By leveraging federal and other sources of research funding, HRI is able to fulfill its mission to become the national clearinghouse for research and development for the nursery and landscape industry.
