## **30 Day Notice**

Interested parties are hereby notified that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (COE), Portland District, proposes to perform work in the navigable waters of this District under the Provisions of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act of 1977 and in accordance with Regulation 33 CFR parts 335-338. This work includes dredging at the mouth of Westport Slough located on the Oregon side of the Columbia River at River Mile (RM) 43.5. The Westport Slough project was originally authorized in 1937 for a channel 28 feet deep. In the past, the Westport Slough channel has been maintained to 12 feet (10 feet plus 2 feet advance maintenance). The Corps is proposing to dredge the entrance of the Westport Slough to a depth of 22 feet (20 feet plus 2 feet advance maintenance) below Columbia River Datum (CRD) because of recent changes in the need for a deeper channel.
