To best facilitate your visit to Harpers Ferry National Historical Park, please review and acknowledge these policies and procedures. If at anytime you have questions or concerns, you may contact the education office at 304-535-6283 or reservations at 304-535-6456.

Within the park:

- Ranger-Led programs will meet at the flagpole outside of the Master Armorer's House, the Lower Town Information Center.
- **Picnicking** is permitted in the designated picnic area, adjacent to the Cavalier Heights parking facility. This area is wheelchair accessible and there are several picnic tables. The second picnic area is along the Shenandoah River, there are no picnic tables in Lower Town. Please make sure all trash in thrown in the proper receptacles.
- **Restrooms** are located on Shenandoah Street next to the park bookstore.
- Snappers/noise-making caps purchased in town are not permitted in the park.
- Archeological, monuments, and statues No walking, climbing, or traversing.

Within the exhibits, please keep in mind:

- **Stop!** No food or drinks inside the buildings.
- Movie times in the John Brown Museum and the Place in Time exhibit are every hour and half-hour.
- **Explore** generally easier in smaller groups.
