

Rebecca Harriett Named Superintendent

Rebecca Harriett has been selected as the Superintendent of Harpers Ferry National Historical Park. She will begin her new position on February 2, replacing Don Campbell, who retired after 29 years as Superintendent at Harpers Ferry.

"I look forward to working with the dedicated employees, volunteers, partners and neighbors of Harpers Ferry. I am especially excited about commemorating the 150th anniversary of John Brown's Raid as we kick-off the Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War," said Harriett.

Currently the Superintendent of Booker T. Washington National Monument in southwest Virginia, Harriett recently served as the Acting Deputy Superintendent at Independence National Historical Park in Philadelphia. She began her Park Service career as a seasonal park ranger at Cape Lookout National Seashore. After graduation, she traveled to Alaska as a seasonal interpreter at Klondike Gold Rush National Historical Park. This led to a permanent position at the Seattle Unit of Klondike in 1980. After 3 years of urban living, she returned to her beloved Cape Lookout National Seashore as a backcountry law enforcement ranger where she met and married her husband, also a park ranger. Together they moved to



the Midwest where Rebecca served as the lead, then eventually, the Chief Ranger at George Washington Carver National Monument in Diamond, Missouri. In 1991 she transferred to Friendship Hill National Historic Site in Pennsylvania as the site's Supervisory Park Ranger overseeing the grand opening and operations of this new NPS unit. While at Friendship Hill she also served as the Acting Chief Ranger for Fort Necessity National Battlefield.

In 2002 Rebecca graduated from the Executive Leadership Program sponsored by the USDA Graduate School. During this training program she was detailed to EPA's Chesapeake Bay Program office in Annapolis, MD, and then to the NPS Office of Congressio-

nal and Legislative Affairs in Washington, D.C. where she helped shepherd through the boundary expansion legislation for Booker T. Washington National Monument.

With a keen interest in international park management issues, Harriett participated in the North America/United Kingdom Countryside Exchange Program at Brecon Beacons National Park, Wales, UK in 1998. She has also served as a delegate to the International Ranger Federation Congresses in Costa Rica, Australia and Scotland. She is a Life Member of the Association of National Park Rangers.

She has a Bachelor of Science Degree in Parks and Recreation Management from North Carolina State University (1979) and completed graduate work in public administration from the University of Washington. She is currently completing her masters in American History from Hollins University in Roanoke, VA.

Rebecca and her husband, Dr. William Robert Lamar, have two teenage sons, Thad, 18, Matthew, 15 and two labs, Hannah and Hermonie. Dr. Lamar is a professor of biology at Ferrum College. The family enjoys hiking, camping, backpacking, kayaking, reading and travel.
