• What is BBS?

Behavior-Based Safety (BBS) is a method to influence safe and at-risk behavior through observation and feedback. This is normally performed on a peer-to-peer exchange bases. The system is employee-owned, and data driven for continuous improvement.

- At-risk behavior is a major contributor in most accidents
- Consequences influence behavior
- Behavior is observable and measurable
- Feedback is essential to improvement
- Quality is built-in early in the process
- A process to enable Safe behavior
