
Uncomplicated Urinary Tract Infection in Women



Short Course Therapy

- 1. Trimethoprim-sulfamethoxazole D.S. 1 twice daily x 3 days
- 2. Trimethoprim 100 mg 1 twice daily x 3 days (Trimethoprim may have a lower side effect profile than Trimethoprim-sulfamethoxazole)

If allergic to Sulfa or Trimethoprim:

- 3. Nitrofurantoin (Macrobid) 100 mg twice daily x 7 days
- 4. Ciprofloxacin 250 mg BID x 3 days (There is concern about emerging resistance.)
