PARKING PERMITS - \$2.00 PER DAY

All participants will be responsible for \$2.00 per day to park a vehicle in residence hall lots. **Fees will be collected at the time of registration.**

HOW DO YOU REGISTER?

You must be at least 14 years of age before January 1, 2008 to attend. You may attend more than once, subject to county approval. The cost of this year's conference is \$130.00 and this fee **must accompany your registration form.** Your Youth Specialist will tell you to whom your check should be made payable and the county deadline date.

TO REGISTER YOU MUST:

Complete your registration form and health form.

Indicate your first through fourth choices. This is to ensure that if you do not get your first choice, you will at least be assigned sessions that are of interest to you. The computer will not accept your registration unless you list four choices. You will note that for some workshops a "Participant Fee" is indicated. This fee will be payable upon arrival. Do not add the fee to your registration fee, since you may not get your first choice. Return the completed registration form to your Youth Specialist by the deadline set for your county. Be sure to enclose the registration fee. There will be no key deposit on residence hall keys: however, those not turning in their keys upon checkout will be charged \$10.00 for the replacement keys. Also, any damage to the room will be billed to the individuals concerned. There will be a \$2.00 charge to replace any lost meal cards.

PIZZA ORDERING



Workshop Descriptions for Wednesday, June 4th from 3-5pm

I-A: Meet Mizzou

Are you thinking about where you want to go for college? The University of Missouri should be at the top of your list. Join us for a campus tour and college-visit experience. You'll learn about admissions, financial aid, and housing, as well as the many degrees and programs that Mizzou offers. Find out if Mizzou is right for you!

I-B: Show Me the Money-Entrepreneurship 101

This session will introduce participants to entrepreneurship as a 4-H project, learn how to see business opportunities in your community, and apply your imagination and skills to earning cash. Love it, plan it, do it. Cost per student is \$10.

I-C: Discover the World of Circle, Square, and Line Dance

A sampling of easy to learn folk, circle, and square dances for the active teen. A great way to meet new friends. Learn the easiest line dance ever, take the "Popcorn Challenge", and don't miss the Patty Cake Polka. Cost per student is \$5.

I-D: **4-Habitat II: Helping Others, Helping the Environment**

Join us for our second 4-Habitat project that helps a family who will soon purchase a Columbia, MO area Habitat for Humanity home! Learn about how youth volunteers in the areas of sustainable architecture, interior design, energy efficiency, landscaping, cooking and nutrition, photography, web design, and communications will work with low-income families who will benefit from all that 4-H/MU Extension has to offer.

Workshop Descriptions for Wednesday, June 4th from 3-5pm

I-E: What Every Horse Wish Their Owner Knew! Helpful Tips for any Horse Enthusiast.

Topics include housing, nutrition, and general health.

I-F: What is Agility?

4-H Members interested in learning basic obedience for agility training will value in enrolling in this 2 hour handson workshop. Live animals and agility stations will be used to create the most favorable learning experience. Sarah Carlisle will be instructing the training. Her experiences in handling dogs include the following: three time national agility championship qualifier, competed at the Incredible Dog Challenge on Animal Planet, two-time UKC agility Premier Winner, top three junior handler in AKC agility from 2003-2005, number one junior handler in UKC agility from 2005-2006, the youngest person to have achieved a MACh title in agility, has been showing dogs since she was eight years old and in the 4-H dog project for 10 year, which included being a junior leader for three years, and teaching dog agility classes for five years. Prior dog experience would be helpful, but is not required.

I-G: Putting the Ha in 4-H for the Health of It!

Join clowns "Liberty" and "Belle" to learn basic make up application, character development and a very short and funny skit. At the end of this workshop you will have a chance to share your inner clown and bring smiles to patients at the Veteran's Hospital located on the MU Campus. You must sign up for IV-G as well. (Workshop participants must pay an additional \$10 in order to cover expenses of a personal make up kit.)

Workshop Descriptions for Wednesday, June 4th from 3-5pm

I-H: Cue the Music!

State Congress choir workshop that will perform songs during the two assemblies. The song titles are "Hooray for Hollywood," "You Raise Me Up" by Josh Groban, and "For Good" from the Musical "Wicked." Cost per student is \$5. This session will be combined on Thursday, so you must also enroll in Thursday's 4 hour session IV-H.

I-I: Livestock Judging Clinic

Refresh your memory on livestock judging terms and contest strategies to maximize your judging ability in this 2 hour clinic. Taught by UMC's premier livestock judging coach, Chris Kemp.

I-J: Skulls and Hides and Tracks, Oh My!

Increase your knowledge of Missouri wildlife, learn secrets of identifying various species, test your skills on furs, tracks, skulls, wings, and scat. Whether you are a novice or consider yourself skilled, you will learn something new in this session.

I-K: Dance-Latin Style!

Learn and practice Latin dance techniques. The instructor is a native of Colombia, South America (and a 4-H Youth Development Specialist, too). Cost per student is \$5.

Workshop Descriptions for Thursday, June 5th from 9-11am

II-A: Swing Into Dance!

Learn and practice Swing dance techniques from a former 4-Her. Cost per student is \$5.

II-B: Leading the Fun!

Come and play fun games and sing crazy songs that you can lead at your 4-H club, camp, or even with your friends! If there is a song or game that you want to share at this workshop- e-mail Melissa Scheer at scheermb@missouri.edu or find me on facebook. Be ready for lots of action and high volume!

II-C: Council Youth Liaisons

Are you a Council Youth Liaison? Are you interested in becoming one? Come work with the State 4-H Council and help strengthen the voice of Missouri 4-H youth! Participants will work closely with the Council to plan the role of Council Youth Liaisons for the coming year, set goals, and get trained. Cost per student is \$5.

II-D: Make-A-Wish "Project Scrapbooks"

Make-A-Wish Foundation of Missouri has enriched the lives of children with life-threatening medical conditions through its wish granting. The goal of "Project Scrapbooks" is to provide each Make-A-Wish child with a scrapbook to preserve the pictures and memories of their event (or "wish"). Participants will be making pages to go into a scrapbook that will be given to Make a Wish Foundation recipients. These scrapbooks really mean a lot to these youth, especially the ones made by other youth. There are approximately 110 children awaiting wishes in Missouri. Cost per student is \$5.

II-E: Emergency Preparedness

This program is an overview of disasters applicable to the region, hazards associated with them and how to be prepared in advance. Based upon Federal Emergency Management Agency guidelines, students learn about early warning, proper response, and maintaining an emergency supply kit. The presentation uses a Power Point slide show and audience participation. Available for students is the Power Point Presentation and Instructor Guide, so they can take the program back home to their groups.

III-A: Snackin'

Learn more about healthy snacks and try new foods that keep you going between meals.

III-B: Thinking (and Living) Outside the Box!

Flexible, creative thinking can be the key to your future! Approaching challenges and solving problems with an open mind can often mean the difference between doing something new and exciting with your life, or merely making the same mistakes over and over again. The good news is, creative problem-solving is a skill you can learn and have a great time doing it!

III-C: Come be a Clover Kid Again!

Are you tired of sitting at meetings and watching the "little kids" have all the fun? Then come take a step back in time and play with us like Clover Kids again!

Workshop Descriptions for Thursday, June 5th from 1:30-3:30pm

III-D: Serving Special Heroes

Heroes come in many sizes. In fact, many of the unsung heroes of the war on global terrorism are military children. In this session, delegates will assemble "Hero Packs" in support of these heroes throughout the state of Missouri. Be a part of this special task and enjoy the excitement of helping others.

III-E: Make-A-Wish "Project Scrapbooks"

Make-A-Wish Foundation of Missouri has enriched the lives of children with life-threatening medical conditions through its wish granting. The goal of "Project Scrapbooks" is to provide each Make-A-Wish child with a scrapbook to preserve the pictures and memories of their event (or "wish"). IV-A: Got a Business Idea? How to Turn Your 4-H Project to Profit!

This session will walk youth with a specific business idea through steps to planning and starting a business. Discover where you can go to obtain money and assistance for turning your 4-H skills into cash. Cost per student is \$10.

IV-B: Outdoor Adventures

Do you enjoy long walks in the woods? Willing to cook your own meal in a Dutch oven? How about testing your skill at tomahawk throwing? Ever hear of a Seneca Run? Looking for independent, resilient, open-minded youth, willing to sample an assortment of primitive skills. Cost per student is \$7.

IV-C: Practical Hands on Horse Care

Learn hands-on, how to give proper horse care. Topics include grooming, bandaging, checking vital signs, measuring heights and weights, showing in hand etc. Cost per student is \$5.

IV-D: Livestock Judging Contest

Practice makes perfect! Hone your skills and have some fun competing in this 4 hour Livestock Judging contest featuring classes in sheep, swine, and beef.

IV-E: Google Sketchup: Designing and Building in 3-D

Sketchup 3-D Design software has quickly become popular for its ease of use. Come see what the buzz is all about! Learn the basic of a program that helps architects and designers present their ideas to clients. Participants in teams who will work together and design and build a virtual community! Cost per student is \$3.

IV-H: Cue the Music!



Michael Johnson


