The 1980s

1980 Established exchange of computer codes with Nuclear Energy Agency Databank

1981 Increased access to international non-nuclear information through bilateral exchange agreements

1981 King Study reported billions of DOE dollars saved due to efficiencies gained through information program

1985 Instrumental in chartering interagency group, CENDI, to focus on federal science information programs

1985 Provided microfiche collections of DOE reports to over 400 libraries around the country

1987 Named operating agent for newly created Energy Technology Data Exchange agreement with 11 participating countries
