CALL BUS TIME at 206-287-8463 for the scheduled departure times of buses at bus stops. All you need to know is your route number.

PICK UP A TIMETABLE at a Metro Customer Service office in downtown Seattle, located at:

- King Street Center, 201 S. Jackson St.
- Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel Westlake Station Mezzanine

Timetables are also available on buses and at more than 500 locations throughout King County, including public libraries, shopping centers, the downtown Seattle post office, University Bookstore, 7-11 stores and Bartell Drugs stores. You can also go to Metro Online to view and print timetables.

So Much for So Little WHAT TO PAY
 Your bus fare can be paid with dollar bills, coins, tickets or a bus pass. Exact fare is required at all times. During weekday peak hours, Metro has a two-zone fare system. The Seattle city limits is the one zone. A transfer is issued only when fare is paid. Peak-hour trips are shaded on Metro's printed timetables.

WHEN TO PAY
 The sign on the farebox (inside the front door of the bus) tells you when to pay. When your travel requires riding a second bus, ask for a transfer when you pay your fare – it's free.

REGIONAL TRANSFER
 Transfers from Community Transit, Everett Transit, King County Metro, Pierce Transit and Sound Transit are accepted for the one-zone base fare.

RIDE FREE AREA
 Between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m., you ride the bus FREE in downtown Seattle. The Ride Free Area is shown on the Metro Downtown Seattle Map to your right.

Passes & Ticketbooks
 You can buy Monthly, 3-Month, 12-Month, and Visitor passes and ticketbooks in person at Metro Customer Service Offices in downtown Seattle at King Street Center, 201 S. Jackson St., and at the Customer Stop on the mezzanine of the Westlake Transit station. You can also order by phone at 206-624-3453 or buy online at www.kingcounty.gov/buypass.
 Passes and ticketbooks are also sold at many retail outlets around King County. Visit Metro Online or call 206-624-PASS for your nearest location. Many companies subsidize passes for their employees too. Ask...yours may be one!

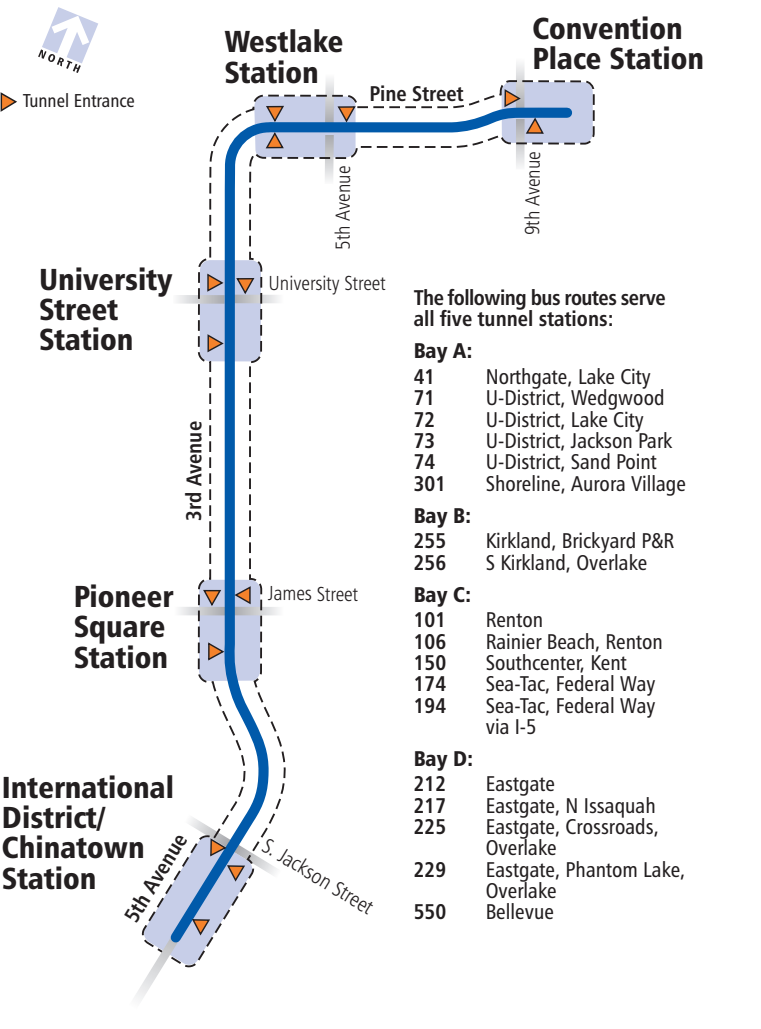
PUGETPASS
 PugetPass is valid as fare payment on Metro Transit and its regional partner systems: Community Transit, Everett Transit, Pierce Transit and Sound Transit. You can use a PugetPass for any regular service ride on any system in our three-county region. If your ride costs more than the value shown on the front of the pass, you may add cash to pay the difference between the cost of the trip and value of the pass.

VISITOR PASS
 When visitors come calling, give them a Metro Visitor Pass. This pass is valid for one day of unlimited travel on all regular and special event Metro service. It's the easy way to see the sights!

UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON U-PASS
 Available only to University of Washington students, faculty and staff, the discounted U-PASS is good for rides on all Metro, Community Transit and Sound Transit routes anytime, anywhere. Users simply show their U-PASS instead of paying the fare. For more information, contact 206-543-0450 or upass@u.washington.edu, or visit www.washington.edu/upass/.

REGIONAL REDUCED FARE PERMIT
 If you are disabled, at least 65 years old, or the possessor of a valid Medicare card, you may buy a Regional Reduced Fare Permit at either Pass Sales Office in downtown Seattle and ride for 50 cents per trip off-peak and peak. Call 206-553-3060 for details.

Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel
 As an extra street for buses, the transit tunnel helps you zip through downtown Seattle. Running between Pine St and Third Ave, the tunnel is inside the downtown Ride Free Area. All tunnel buses stop at the five tunnel stations: Convention Place, Westlake, University Street, Pioneer Square, and International District/Chinatown. The tunnel is open from 5 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday-Friday and closed weekends and holidays. Sound Transit light rail trains will join buses in the tunnel in 2009, when the link rail line begins operation to and from Sea-Tac Airport.



Convenient Connections for Faster Trips
 Refer to the maps in this guide for locations of transit connections available to you, and the bus routes that serve them.
• Park-and-Ride Lots – More than 65 lots to choose from. Look for the symbol.
• Transit Centers – Strategically located throughout King County for easy access to regional transit service. Look for the symbol.
• Major transfer points – Look for the symbol.
• Connections with regional transit agencies – Sound Transit, Community Transit and Pierce Transit routes serving King County are shown on the system map with color-coded route numbers.

DART (Dial-A-Ride Transit) SERVICE
 Provides fixed and limited variable routing service in designated areas of the county as noted on the system map. Call 1-866-261-DART or 1-800-246-1646 (TTY) for reservations and information.

Services for All Types of Riders
SENIORS AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES
 All Metro buses are accessible to senior citizens or disabled persons, including riders who use wheelchairs. Seating is reserved in the front of the bus. Accessible

stops display the accessible symbol. Seniors and disabled people unable to use regular bus service may be eligible for other services. For more information, call 206-263-3113 or 206-263-3116 (TTY).
BICYCLISTS
 All Metro buses are equipped with bicycle racks. Each rack holds two or three bicycles. Bicyclists can transport their bikes on any Metro bus on a first-come, first-served basis. No additional fare is required. Bicycles may be loaded or unloaded at any bus stop at any time, except on streets in the Ride Free Area between 6 a.m. and 7 p.m. During these hours, loading and unloading bikes is restricted to a rider's first and last stop in the Ride Free Area.

When the Downtown Seattle Transit Tunnel is open, bicycles may be loaded and unloaded in all tunnel stations at any time. Please walk your bike in tunnel stations and use elevators or stairs to transport your bike between levels. Bikes are not allowed on escalators. While waiting for a bus, stand at the head of the bus bay behind the yellow textured strip until the bus comes to a complete stop. Use caution when stepping between the platform and the roadway.

EVENING RIDERS
 Metro offers special Night Stop service from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. At your request, your driver can let you off at any point along your bus route where it is safe for the bus to stop. Drivers cannot make Night Stops in the Ride Free Area.

DESTINATION & ROUTE INFORMATION

Ride Safe, Ride Smart
 You can help provide a safe, secure, and pleasant bus experience for everyone by following these tips, enforced by Metro's Code of Conduct.
 • Pay the right fare
 • Respect other passengers' privacy
 • Do not cause safety problems
 • Use headphones
 • No eating, smoking or littering
 • No alcoholic beverages
 • Do not harass driver or other riders
 • Do not lie down on seats
 • Respect transit property
 • Use Metro services and facilities for transportation purposes only

You may be asked to leave the bus if you do not follow these rules.

BE SAFE!
 • Never try to board or exit a moving bus
 • Buses will not stop once they leave a bus stop
 • Don't cross in front of or behind a bus at a bus stop
 • Wait until the bus leaves the stop, and then cross carefully
 • Allow passengers to exit the bus before you board
 • Hold on to the handrails and handgrips inside the bus
 • In crowded buses, move to the back of the bus to make room for others
 • Stay clear of the doors and keep the aisles clear
 • Keep your head, arms and objects inside bus windows
 • Please allow the bus driver to secure wheelchairs
 • Hold on to the railing when exiting the bus
 • As you leave the bus, watch for cars

LOOKING OUT FOR YOU
 Some Metro buses are equipped with on-board security cameras that provide a complete view of the bus interior. Passenger activity is recorded to help ensure your safety.

HELP ALL ALONG THE WAY
 We want to make your bus trips as fast and convenient as possible, and deliver service you can count on and appreciate. That's why we offer assistance to help you get the most out of riding the bus, before, during and after your ride. See the back panel of this brochure for a listing of the many ways to reach us.
