| <i>Categories of Records in the System</i>   | Railroad employee's name, address, social security number, date of birth, place of birth, mother's and father's names, sex, occupation and employer.   |
| <i>Authority for Maintenance of the System</i>   | Section 7(b)(6) of the Railroad Retirement Act of 1974 (45 U.S.C. 231f(b)(6)).   |
| <i>Purpose(s)</i>  | The purpose of the system is to provide information on railroad employees who completed Carrier Employee Registration forms (CER-1) to apply for a Social Security number (SSN). The information on these CERA-1 forms was available only at the Railroad Retirement Board.  |
| <i>Routine Uses of Records Maintained in the System, Including Categories of Users and Purposes of Such Uses</i> | a. Records which consist of name, date and place of birth, social security number, and parents' names may be disclosed to the Social Security Administration to verify social security number and date of birth.<br><br>b. Records may be disclosed in a court proceeding relating to any claims for benefits by the beneficiary under the Railroad Retirement Act, or Unemployment Insurance Act and may be disclosed during the course of an administrative appeal to individuals who need the records to prosecute or decide the appeal or to individuals who are requested to provide information relative to an issue involved in the appeal.<br><br>c.
