



#### Toward Better Collaboration


- Have the right people on your team

### 35 Projects: Where & How They Happened






#### **Applegate Fuel Reduction 2005**



### What This Accomplishes

- \* Projects are more strategic
- Permanent relationships develop between agencies
- Feds welcome working with private residents & vice versa!
- ♦ Better rate of implementation
- Private stewardship develops



## Working together — a piece of calee?

- Up-front, detailed CWPP project planning takes longer.
- ♦ NEPA = time. Can feds keep up?
- Fuels versus the commercial component: can they be separated?
- ♦ Collaboration vs. lawsuits
- Funding: does \$1.3 million in grants for private fuel reduction help federal budgets?
