After the tragic accidental death of Marvin Ference, the President of Canvena in March 1999, the web site name was changed to Deerfarmer.com. Deerfarmer.com has since become one of the most popular deer sites on the Net. In 1999, the site received 1.2 million hits and had 62,000 user sessions. Currently the site is receiving between 6,000 to 8,000 hits per day!
