- World's foremost coral reef Science meeting
- International scientists, managers, conservationists, NGOs, and young investigators.
- Prior Okinawa, Bali, Panama, Guam, Tahiti, Philippines, Australia, India.
- Held every 4 years.
- Last on U.S. mainland in 1977.
- >~2,500 attendees anticipated.
- Largest Coral Meeting in World
- IYOR-08 Centerpiece

- Goal: scientific understanding of coral reefs




