


## Financing the Protected Areas Network Republic of Palau

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


#### **REPUBLIC OF PALAU**

- Population: 19,000
- Land Area: 481 km²
- Sea Area: 600,900
   km²
- 586 islands spread over more than 700 km from Velasco Reef in the north to Helens Reef in the south.
- No. of visitors: 80,000 (2004)

Protected Areas Network Act (Nov. 2003)

- National framework to <u>support</u> state and community level action.
- Dual purposes of the PAN Act:
  - Address local resource management needs
  - Protect nation-wide biodiversity, habitats & natural resources
- Includes marine & terrestrial areas



#### Protected Areas Network Act

- Full range of protected areas options.
- Requires a fully collaborative effort at the community, State and National levels
- Other resource management and planning actions will be required












#### Main Components of PAN

# Supportive Policies: Selection Criteria


- Criteria

- Completed studies:
  - Hydrodynamic modeling
  - Habitat classification study
  - Spawning aggregation study
  - Ngerikill watershed resource assessment.
- Close collaboration with partners incl.: Belau National Museum, PCS, PICRC, CRRF, the TNC Reef Resilience WG






#### Effective management at State level


Goals:

#### Sustainable Financing Next Steps

- Strategy to engage key international donors in the capitalization of an endowment
- Establishment of a non-profit corporation to manage and disburse funds
