AWEE will partner with the Arizona Department of Corrections and Perryville Prison to actively recruit clients and provide pre/post release services.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: AWEE's "*Paths to Living Free*" program will offer intensive work readiness training and placement classes in both English and Spanish, where participants are eligible to receive credits from local community colleges, including Rio Salado Community College, Maricopa Skill Center, and the University of Advancing Computer Technologies. Participants will also receive GED preparation and testing services, transitional employment, career development, substance abuse counseling, emergency and housing assistance, health care services, family reunification services, substance abuse counseling and mentoring services.

NON-FEDERAL MATCH: Non-Federal resources of \$51,400 in state revenue and \$15,562 in local revenue will be leveraged for this initiative.
