### Analysis

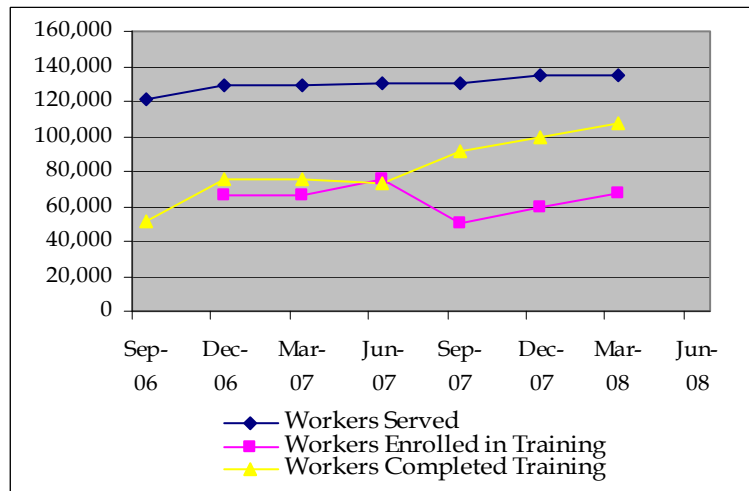
- Over 134,600 workers are expected to be served under this initiative

### Program Description

The High Growth Job Training Initiative employs targeted education and skills development resources toward helping workers gain the skills they need to build successful careers. The initiative engages business, education, and the workforce investment system for the development of integrated solutions to the workforce challenges facing high growth industries. This initiative invests in national models and demonstrations of solutions in each of the 13 targeted high growth industries.

### Program Innovations

A major program innovation for this quarter involves upgrading the nation's automotive programs to Industry Standard. Gateway Technical College has been employed to develop a Web site that provides tools and guidance for automotive training centers looking to achieve or maintain National Automotive Technicians Education Foundation (NATEF) certification. The Web site also directs automotive instructors to the Web site of Melior Inc., where they can complete, online, the required 20 hours of continuing education needed to maintain their ASE certification.
