

## **Delaware Workforce Investment Board Executive Summary PY02**

Last year Delaware was sanctioned for failure to meet one (1) out of the seventeen (17) mandated performance measurement standards for two consecutive years. The standards were established as part of the original 5-Year Strategic Plan for Delaware Workforce Investment Board (DWIB).

DWIB members worked diligently with DWIB staff, DE Department of Labor and US Department of Labor to develop a corrective action plan. In addition, Ed Ratledge from the Center for Applied Demography and Survey Research (CADSR), University of Delaware, did extensive research and presented scientific data that was critical to the process for re-negotiating the previously established goals.

At the end of the previous program year, DE had failed to meet the 80% threshold for 5 of the performance goals. DWIB leadership participated in several negotiation sessions with U.S. Department of Labor representatives and successfully re-negotiated lower goals for all 5 of the measures that we failed last year. The following illustrates the results of these negotiations:

Retention Rate – Dislocated Workers: was 85%, negotiated to 77%  
Retention Rate – Older Youth: was 73%, negotiated to 65%  
Earnings Change – Adults: was \$3,000, negotiated to \$2,400  
Earnings Change – Older Youth: was \$3,277, negotiated to \$1,400  
Diploma Rate – Younger Youth: was 57%, negotiated to 52%

These re-negotiated goals, as well as an overall improvement in actual performance, resulted in the successful attainment of 4 of these 5 performance standards.

Overall, the actual performance of our workforce system demonstrated a positive improvement in the performance levels in nine (9) out of seventeen (17) standards.

The Older Youth Earnings Change actual performance for this year was \$787. We needed to reach \$1,120 (80% of the \$1,400 goal), to achieve the minimum acceptable level. Last year's performance was \$865. This is the 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive year we have failed to meet the minimum performance in this category.

We sincerely regret the outcome, but wanted to take a moment to outline the significant effort that was made by DWIB and staff. It is also important to note that the cohort that is measured in this category include participants who exited the program between October 1, 2001 and September 30, 2002. By the time we began root cause analysis and research, most of these young men and women had already exited the system, thus limiting in our ability to further influence their specific outcomes.

We continue to develop corrective action steps that include improved eligibility and assessment determination prior to training, expanded training and resources for appropriate exit strategies for our One-Stop case managers, and closer coordination and monitoring of the performance of our training providers.

We have a core group of strong, dedicated leaders who have donated extensive time and energy to improving workforce development initiatives for Delaware. DWIB used scientific data and research to develop goals that were directly correlated with Delaware's economy, labor market demand and the objectives of Workforce Investment Act. We remain confident that as we move forward we will attain success and accomplish the goals established by DWIB and US Department of Labor.

Please meet some of Delaware's **"Faces of Success"**:

Doretha Hobbs came to the WIA funded Challenge Program construction training in the fall of 2001 looking to gain some carpentry skills and increase her employment opportunities. She dropped out of high school when she was 16, but had managed to earn a GED while in Job Corps. Since graduation from the Job Corps she had been unable to find employment. The Challenge Program offered Dee the opportunity to further her carpentry skills, refresh her basic educational training, and increase her self-confidence.



Dee found that the hands-on training offered at the Challenge Program fit her learning style perfectly. She immediately proved her willingness to learn through perfect attendance and punctuality. Upon enrollment Dee found that her TABE scores had slipped to well below the 10<sup>th</sup> grade level, and she was going to need some work to increase her scores. Within a few months in our education program her scores improved enough that she scored well above the 10<sup>th</sup> grade level and passed the ASVAB test for entry into the military. On the carpentry site Dee found that her lack of confidence and her lack of problem solving experience were a hindrance, and sought to improve them through practice. She worked extra hours on Fridays, and volunteered for any other extra work that might come around. As a single woman trying to pay rent and live on her own, the stipend allowed for the program was barely sufficient to make ends meet. But she knew that if she completed the program and graduated that the hard work would pay off.

The Challenge Program offered Dee the combination of a safe learning environment, free from the stresses of the workplace, and practical construction training that made it a perfect opportunity to set goals beyond the most basic menial jobs. In the winter of 2002 Dee began to work on Thursdays and Fridays with a local metal sculptor on a gate for the Delaware Center for Horticulture

through a Challenge Program partnership. It proved to be a valuable opportunity for Dee not only to do some interesting metal work, but also to have a supervisor and job that were not affiliated with a training program. She propelled these experiences into a desire to enter the military and join their construction corps.

Dee entered military service in the fall of 2002, and completed basic training just before Christmas. In the spring of 2003, she was notified that she would be deployed in the Persian Gulf, and she shipped out for Kuwait in May of 2003. We last heard from Dee from a satellite phone in Iraq in late July, and all was well. She said she is proud to serve our country and understands that she will bring home a completely different perspective and invaluable experience. We are looking forward to a visit upon her safe return.

Victoria was a 1999 high school graduate with numerous short-term clerical positions. She was unhappy in clerical work but had no training for the healthcare arena, which was the industry that she longed for. DWIB funded a program through Delaware Technical & Community College (DTCC) that offered hope for Victoria. On August 5, 2002 Victoria enrolled in DTCC, Terry Campus, Nurse's Assistant Training Program for Out of School Youth. She had good work ethics and earned the respect of her classmates and other staff during Clinical training. Victoria successfully completed 10/18/02 with the highest grade point over 95%.

She then applied for employment at Bayhealth Medical Center in Milford, DE, and began work November 18, 2002. She continues to work full time, and is now enrolled at Delaware Tech, Terry Campus, working toward an RN degree.

Victoria has moved from a tentative, unsure student into a proud, motivated credit student and valuable employee in a medical setting providing caring, competent nursing assistant care.



Wage Gains in Delaware: Research Notes  
Ed Ratledge, University of Delaware


Measuring wage gains in Delaware is somewhat hazardous for several reasons. First, it is a complex, regional labor market with significant movement across state boundaries in both directions. Second, employers who are self-insured such as are found in the non-profit sector do not report individual wages. Taken together, these factors make it difficult to track wages for about 20% of the labor force. When wage gains are calculated for program participants, it is difficult to know if a person is or was not employed or were employed by a firm that doesn't report. These factors will have substantial impact on the calculations.

To illustrate the problem, a group of 238 adults, that exited programs during the period 7/1/00-6/30/01 and had evidence of wages during the first quarter after exit, were analyzed. The wage gain was calculated as the difference in wages between the second and third quarters before entering the program and the second and third quarters after exit. The average wage gain was \$1928.60 but this is only part of the story. The graph below shows the distribution of wage gains within the sample.

As is readily apparent, the range is substantial \$-16,925 to +\$26,640. The median was \$1862.50 and there is some skew to the right in the distribution. The most likely or modal value is a gain of \$0. If we trim the distribution of the outliers, then a more compact distribution appears with a less pronounced skew and the mean is reduced slightly to \$1805.80 and the median is only slightly reduced to \$1852.





Using the remaining 229 observations a couple of simple models were developed. The first model looked at the impact of pre-program wages on the wage gain. Of particular interest was the impact of zero wages in prior quarters.

The result shows that zero wages in the prior third quarter adds \$3,900 to the total wage gain while zero wages in the prior second quarter adds an additional \$1,900. The expected wage gain for those reporting wages in both quarters was \$171. These results are hardly surprising and a reasonable person could conclude that people with employment records should not be accepted if wage gains were to be maximized. In general, each dollar of prior wages decreases the expected gains by more than \$.60.

One of the more interesting aspects of this population is the actual wages being earned. The prior six-month wages were \$3828 while the after six-month wages were \$5634.



These graphs need to be put in context. A full-time minimum wage worker would make about \$6000 for the six-months while some one making an average Delaware wage would make \$12,000. Only a small portion of the before and after wages rise to that level.

What appears to be happening is that a good portion of the wage gains are coming from workers that were unemployed becoming employed at the minimum wage or working part-time.

One other comparison is useful. This is clearly a low-income group. If the same criteria are applied to calculating gains using the full DOL matched wage file a roughly comparable group of 73,000 shows gains during the same time period of \$2,000.

As we move forward in time the labor market is changing. Unemployment rates are rising and the civilian labor force is stagnant. Annual wage increases have been in the 2% range and opportunities for job-hopping are less. This will make it more difficult to show gains unless the proportion of people in the program with zero wages increase.

**Performance Measures Renegotiation: Notes On The Delaware Economy For The  
Delaware Workforce Investment Board  
April 11, 2003**

Overview

A quick snapshot of the Delaware economy's job picture shows the following:

- Total nonfarm jobs (seasonally adjusted) peaked at 422,400 in the first quarter of 2001;
- For five straight quarters after that, jobs declined to 412,300 in the second quarter of 2002, a loss of 10,100 jobs, or 2.4 percent;
- The final two quarters of 2002 reversed this trend, but just barely – job growth for the entire second half of 2002 totaled only 500 jobs;
- In 2001, Delaware lost 600 jobs; in 2002, another 6,400. For the first two months of 2003, we have already lost another 2,400 jobs.

Forecast

Our short-term forecast is for weak job growth for the next two years. We expect the State to grow 3,300 new jobs for 2003, and 1,500 jobs for 2004. By comparison, our average annual job growth for the years 1993 through 2000 was 9,600. Our outlook for 2003 is, therefore, just 35% of that pace, and for 2004, only 16% of that level.

However - and at this point it may be a bigger than usual “however” – there is still a chance, albeit a very small one, that the economy could recover later this year and generate greater job growth than we predict. The factors that make this unlikely include high levels of both individual and corporate debt; high federal deficits for the foreseeable future; the strictures on every state economy, resulting in a broad and varying mixture of service cuts, tax increases and layoffs; and the reluctance of employers to commit to hiring and investments under uncertainty. It is also just as likely that the national economy could slip back into recession. This is important for Delaware because, as the nation goes, so generally goes Delaware's economy, as shown by national and Delaware job totals peaking, and then resuming growth, at precisely the same time during this recession.

Our confidence in predicting Delaware employment levels is quite high. In general, our accuracy level in forecasting one quarter out is 99.7%; and for each quarter farther out, our accuracy recedes slightly, as would be expected. For our eight quarter forecast (two years), our accuracy level is 98.2 percent.

Employer Requirements

This is quite probably the most unforgiving economic situation imaginable for minimum-skilled persons. The mantra of employers, Delaware firms included, is “employability, not employment”. Workers are expected to be part of a value chain that delivers increasing benefits to customers, based upon continuous improvement of one kind or another. The ability to absorb – and generate returns to - training investments, especially technological - is now a standard business expectation, and therefore critical to aspiring workers. Employers (including Delaware employers, from our work with them) demand – not by choice, but by global competition, the following:

1. written and verbal communication skills;
2. leadership skills;
3. problem solving and analytical skills;
4. computer literacy;
5. strong interpersonal skills;
6. teamwork.

### Job Outlook

Currently, 40% of jobs (new and replacement) require only short-term training (30 days or less), while those requiring moderate training (between 30 days and one year) represent another 14 percent. But the short-term training jobs will grow by just 16% over the next decade, and those requiring moderate training will grow by only 10 percent. By comparison, jobs calling for an Associates Degree will grow by 35 percent.

### Education And Income

The old saying is that “ignorance costs and education pays”. According to the 2000 Census, those with the least education paid the highest cost: those without a high school diploma earned an average of \$16,121 per year - \$7.75/hour.

## Original (2000) Performance Measures

To create the original national WIA performance measures, the U.S. Department of Labor used seven test states as barometers: Florida, Indiana, Kentucky, Nevada, Texas, Utah, and Vermont. Preparatory to negotiation of Delaware's original measures in 2000, Dr. George Sharpley, Jr. of our staff examined the differences in economic conditions between Delaware and the seven test states. Two of his conclusions bear repeating:

1. Overall, the differences between Delaware and the test states in unemployment rate, job growth, average wages, and business formation were probably not enough to warrant significantly lower standards for Delaware. *More importantly – neither did these differences support higher standards;*
2. About 10% of total Delaware employment is in areas where no UI wage records are collected, such as hospitals, nonprofits, and universities. *Yet, none of the test states had this problem – all received UI wage records for job sectors that Delaware does not.* On top of this, WIA mandates UI wage records as the source of wage records. The result: this disparity - in itself – would cause Delaware to fall *five to seven percentage points below* the average entered employment rate.

Admittedly, WIA does allow “supplemental sources” to establish employment for the entered employment measure. But there are two very important “but” issues here:

- expenses – scarce dollars must be spent to gather this information, and the expense will rise as a more complete count is attempted. Moreover, every dollar allocated to such work is a dollar less for programs;
- nonprofits – WIA/ITA recipients enter nonprofit work at a higher proportion than for the economy as a whole, thus making the cost of an acceptable count even higher. Yet without spending scarce dollars to achieve this, the missing wage problem – and the falsely negative picture it creates of Delaware performance on wages and entered employment - remains. Thus, the Delaware Workforce Investment Board is faced with a no-win situation: spend program dollars on an acceptable count to verify performance, or spend on training for job placement – much of which cannot be verified, thus making the problem even worse.

## Concluding Implications For Revised Performance Measures

1. The Delaware economy, now and through 2004, cannot – and will not - absorb jobseekers at a number and pace to achieve anything close to current performance measures. The most fertile seeds in the world will not grow on barren ground;
2. WIA/ITA recipients represent, by and large, those who bring the least to employers in skills, education, and labor market experience. In comparison with

- non-WIA/ITA jobseekers, they are at a severe comparative disadvantage, especially since many lack the “skill kit” now routinely demanded by employers;
3. While many jobs requiring only short-term training will be available, their share of total job growth will decline, and their wages mirror the minimal skills required. These are entry-level opportunities only, and are not generally the sort of positions that employers look upon as candidates for greater investment. They are “door openers”, not career launchers – or family supporters. Also, the trend by employers in contracting out all but core functions, and using part-time and temporary workers will only accelerate, thus creating even fewer such job openings over time;
  4. WIA/ITA recipients with less than a high school education represent, purely as a matter of return on investment, the greatest risks. This is most especially true of the “hardest to serve” population such as former offenders;
  5. The current performance measures were created at a time of robust and widespread economic growth. That time is no more, and will not be, at least through 2004. This does not suggest that the original measures were once correct, and are now suddenly incorrect. It is simply a reflection of the simple truth that performance measures built during good times cannot possibly apply in bad times. Were they to, they would constitute an expectations “straitjacket” that the Delaware Workforce Investment Board could not escape;
  6. The UI wage record gap requires, by itself, a reduction in the entered employment measure of between five and seven percentage points.
