Dear Dr. Hiddlestone -

It was very good of you to send me a book for my journey - and I certainly appreciate your thoughtfulness. As perhaps you know my steamer packages were not put on board the Kroonland through some body's stupid mistake but they were sent on another boat & I got the box here. Books are more than acceptable in this part of the world - we got mine only once a month & the local paper contains nothing but advertisements. I have had a very strenuous overhauling journey which I will tell you about on my return - but at least I am here & actually at work. At times, I think

that Leopoldville ^{must} ~~will~~ be on another planet.

The laboratory building is in the process of construction - but

the ground floor of 3 rooms is practically finished. There is no electricity or power but the permanent equipment is fairly good. The director has charge of the negro hospital in which there are about 70 advanced cases of sleeping sickness undergoing the routine Atarov & Smettova treatment. 0.5 g Atarov on Monday - 0.1 g Smettova on Thursday. I was given 3 relapses to begin on - a most unfortunate type of case - but the next day, an early untreated patient arrived 2.0 grans of AB3 cleared the cervical lymph glands of bypasses within 21 hours & I am now waiting to see when a relapse takes place. I hope to get ^{more} ~~the~~ similar cases from the nearest epidemic center - about 500 miles away!
