# Brigadier General Thomas P. Bostick

## Commanding General



Brigadier General Thomas P. Bostick serves as the second Commander of the Gulf Region Division of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and Deputy for Construction, Project and Contracting Office in Baghdad, Iraq.

He most recently served as the Assistant Division Commander-Maneuver, and then as Assistant Division Commander-Support, 1st Cavalry Division, from August 2002 through April 2004, deploying with the division in support of OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM, Kuwait. Since his commissioning, General Bostick has served in a variety of command and staff assignments, both in the Continental United States and overseas. He served as a Platoon Leader, Battalion Maintenance Officer, Executive Officer and commanded Company B while assigned to the 54th Engineer Battalion in Germany. General Bostick served as an Assistant Professor, Department of Mechanics at the United States Military Academy. In 1989, he was selected as a White House Fellow and served with the Department of Veterans Affairs.

General Bostick returned to United States Army Europe, where he served as Engineer Operations Officer, United States Army Europe and Seventh Army, Germany, followed by assignments as 40th Engineer Battalion, S-3, and 1st Armored Division Engineer Brigade, S-3. He then returned to the National Capitol Region to serve as Executive Officer to the Chief of Engineers. In 1994, General Bostick assumed command of the 1st Engineer Battalion, 1st Infantry Division, Ft. Riley, Kansas. Returning to Germany in 1997, he assumed command of the Engineer Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division and deployed in support of OPERATION JOINT FORGE, Bosnia-Herzegovina.

General Bostick was Executive Officer to the Chief of Staff, United States Army from June 1999 through May 2001, and he served as the Deputy Director of Operations for the National Military Command Center, J-3, Joint Staff until July 2002.

General Bostick graduated from the United States Military Academy in 1978 with a Bachelor of Science Degree. He also holds a Masters degree in both Civil Engineering and Mechanical Engineering from Stanford University, and is a graduate of the U.S. Army War College.

General Bostick's awards and decorations include the Defense Superior Service Medal, Legion of Merit (with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters), Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (with 4 Oak Leaf Clusters), Joint Service Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal (with Oak Leaf Cluster), Army Achievement Medal, Parachutist Badge, Ranger Tab, and Joint and Army Staff Identification Badges.

General Bostick is married and has a son in college.
