
"From the Big Bang to the Discovery of Alien Life" Dr. John C. Mather

NASA Senior Astrophysicist, Goddard Fellow, Chief Scientist & Nobel Laureate 6:30 p.m., Thursday, 6 December 2007

Dr. John C. Mather is a Senior Astrophysicist in the Observational Cosmology Laboratory at NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center (GSFC). His research centers on infrared astronomy and cosmology. As an NRC postdoctoral fellow at the Goddard Institute for Space Studies (New York City), he led the proposal efforts for the Cosmic Background Explorer (COBE; 74-76), and came to GSFC to be the Study Scientist (76-88), Project Scientist (88-98), and also the Principal Investigator for the Far Infra-Red Absolute Spectrophotometer (FIRAS) on COBE. He showed that the cosmic microwave background radiation has a blackbody spectrum within 50 ppm. As Senior Project Scientist (95-present) for the James Webb Space Telescope, he leads the science team, and represents scientific interests within the project management. Dr. Mather is also Chief Scientist of the Science Mission Directorate (SMD) at NASA Headquarters, where he provides independent scientific advice on all aspects of the NASA science program.

Dr. Mather, a member of the National Academy of Sciences and Fellow of the American Physical Society, was awarded the 2006 Nobel Prize in Physics (with George Smoot) for his work on COBE. He is a long-time member of the University of Maryland Chapter of Sigma Xi
