The 2009 List will be our 14th mail order catalog! The nursery is almost 20 years old and we definitely claim this has been a long and consuming journey full of great experiences and good friends. A few customers have been there since the beginning, some for several years, and many of you have recently found Naylor Creek Nursery...all are very much appreciated. We hope to continue to bring you the newest and most exciting hostas and other shade tolerant perennials for many more years. We cannot accommodate visitors to the nursery as the "crew" consists of only the two of us and time is always short. Please use the catalog and website to allow us to help fill your gardening needs. You will also find us at several West Coast Flower Shows, many shows and sales throughout the Northwest, and at the Hosta Conventions in their various locations. Again, there are many new hosta introductions which means we must continue to trim our list to the number of plants the nursery can hold and we can successfully grow...many older varieties will no longer be available. We are working with a broadening group of great hybridizers so look for many new and exciting introductions from here, in the states, and Europe. Epimedium selections continue to increase each year and this will be an ongoing endeavor. Other companion plants also rank high on our priority list but we do offer a wider variety at the shows than in the catalog. Our growing season commences early and we try to grow many things in quart containers which make nice sized plants that can be shipped throughout the season. When ordering, please note if there is an additional shipping fee for certain plants due to weight.

We continue to grow mostly tissue-cultured plants, this allows us to bring production to market at a reasonable price and maintain adequate supplies. Also, tissue-culture aids in the attempt to assure we are providing disease free plants. We, and our suppliers, are testing old and new plant stocks on a regular basis in the hope of accomplishing this goal.



A word about our plants...

The majority of our plants are grown in containers and have excellent root systems that will re-establish quickly in your landscape. Plants are shipped bare root and, wherever possible, multi-eyed divisions will be sent. We are often asked what size plants we ship...most are from 1-quart to 1-gallon size. In the quest to offer disease free plant material we are selling more and more tissue-cultured stock so if you see a plant listed that has been selling at a very high price and it's listed at a reasonable price, chances are it's tissue-cultured. We now usually sell tissue-cultured plants in their second or third season and find this is generally sufficient time to make sure they're growing well and are true-to-type. We offer many new and rare cultivars of which we have limited supply. Due to growing conditions beyond our control or because of heavy demand for certain plants we advise ordering early. We will not substitute unless you tell us to do so. We will always do our best to resolve any problems and also appreciate hearing when you are happy with and have good results with our plants! All plants and the nursery are inspected by Washington State on a regular schedule.

Hosta Virus X...In the past couple of years a virus known as Virus X has been on the increase in the hosta world and we want you to know we are being very proactive and taking the strongest measures to keep our stock clean. We, and our suppliers, are doing constant testing of new and old plant material and exercising the utmost vigilance in an attempt to make sure you receive clean and healthy stock. The virus makes the plant quite ugly and gives it a very blotchy appearance. These plants should be carefully destroyed. The virus is spread by a cut or a wound that allows the sap to leak from one plant to another often occurring when dividing a plant. Keeping knives and other garden tools quite clean will help considerably to keep from spreading the virus should you have a problem plant and be unaware of it. Most reputable nurseries and garden centers are now becoming educated about the problem but some of the mass outlets that turn thousands of inexpensive plants are showing heavy numbers of infected plants. We feel with education of the growers and the gardening community this problem will be eradicated in the near future. 

Shipping Information and charges...

All orders will be shipped by Priority Mail. (we no longer use UPS due to cost)

We ship March 25th through October 15th. <u>Earlier or later shipments are possible</u> but prior scheduling is necessary...we will accommodate your needs wherever possible.

We have had excellent results shipping Priority Mail and find it opens our shipping schedule to any day of the week. Service has been faster than UPS (even orders to the East Coast arrive in 2-3 days) and the cost is much less expensive. Not only does the Post Office deliver on Saturday, but they also keep mail moving over the weekend.

***The Post Office now offers email notification of package departure at no extra cost. If you would like us to utilize this service please provide your email address with your order and you will be notified when your shipment leaves us. They will also provide you with a tracking number.


Payment Information...

Hostas are very hardy, adaptable, easy to grow and principally known for their foliage. They come in sizes from miniature to giant, in colors from solids of green, blue or gold or variegations of mixed colors of border and center. Flowers are borne on scapes, some are fragrant, and most all bloom between May and September. They prefer rich, slightly acidic, well-draining soil that retains some moisture and do best in part shade. Hostas can tolerate some sun, morning sun is best and the amount depends on your particular climate...these are shade-tolerant plants not shade-loving. A dormant period is required and is usually brought on by shorter days or first frost in the fall. Propagate by division and best done in early spring as the plant emerges but is not required. They have few diseases and the only significant pests are slugs and snails...we also hear of problems with deer where there are heavy populations. Hostas are low maintenance plants and will truly be a great addition to your garden.



**Amazing Grace [M/L] (Ward) Large dark green leaves are surrounded by a beautiful wide creamy-white border that is slightly rippled. Good substance and vigorous grower with pale lavender flowers mid summer..................18.00

<u>American Halo</u> [L] (Van Wade) Chosen for its superior form and beauty...large blue leaves are surrounded by a wide creamy-white margin. Topped with white flowers in early summer..........12.00










<u>Baby Blue Eyes</u> [mini/small] (Solberg) Very blue, heart-shaped leaves form a showy, flat clump with a tight growing habit. Great substance and lavender flowers on 8-10" scapes. Grows well and looks great.............15.00





**Cathedral Windows PP17295 [L] (Hansen) Wonderful sport from H. 'Stained Glass'...vigorous grower with heart-shaped leaves that have a glowing golden center between the very wide dark green border. 

**Cookie Crumbs [mini] (Solberg/Zilis) Small heart-shaped green leaves have a wide border and are topped with lavender flowers...makes a nice dense little clump.......12.00



<u>Deep Blue Sea</u> [M] (C. Seaver) One of the most outstanding "blues" we grow...round leaves are very blue and very corrugated with super substance and a heavy glaucous bloom. Flowers appear end of July and are pale lavender and closed......12.00

Dorset Blue [S] (Smith/Aden) TF2X4 Round blue-green leaves are heart-shaped and cup slightly...one of the best of the Eric Smith Tardiana hybrids. Lovely white flowers and excellent slug resistance.......9.00

**Dream Maker [M/L] (Strandberg) This wonderful streaked sport comes from H. 'Blue Angel' and has lots of creamy-yellow streaks and blotches against the beautiful blue background. The clump will be topped with white flowers and Mark says the plant is fertile. Plants offered are 3rd year tissue culture and are good size...they vary a lot but all are nicely



Dream Queen [M] (Jan Van den Top) A sport from H. 'Great Expectations' and similar to H. 'Dream Weaver' and H. 'Thunderbolt'...thick leaves have a creamy center surround by a wide blue-green margin. Much better grower than its parent and

Dusty Waters [M] (Naylor Creek Nursery) This is the all blue sport of H. 'Lakeside Cupcake'...vigorous grower with thick "dusty" blue, heart-shaped leaves makes a low dense mound that holds up very well...lots of slug resistance and maintains a good

Earth Angel [L] (Hans Hansen/Shady Oaks Nursery) A variegated sport from H. 'Blue Angel'...large thick heart-shaped blue-green leaves have a wide creamy-white border. Topped with lavender flowers..12.00

Great introduction from Don Dean...

Ebony Towers [M] (Dean) This introduction from Don Dean loves the sun and becomes a dense mound of glossy, wavy green foliage that appears to be in constant motion. Speckled red-purple petioles form the base and stalwart, saturated, black-purple scapes of 40+" emerge in late August which display 2 3/4"

El Nino PP14632 [M] (Warmerdam) Sport of H. 'Halcyon'...very blue leaves surrounded by a tidy bright white border. Good substance and topped with lilac flowers. In the right location this plant can be absolutely stunning and will look great all season. 10.00

**Electrocution [S/M] (Avent) We have been very impressed with this new intro from Tony Avent...long green leaves have a yellow border (later turns to white) and are twisted severely as they reach upward. A vigorous grower that definitely requires a

Elkhart Lake [M] (Cees Visser) This plant has been around for a while but has not been available until now...comes from the same gentleman who gave us H. 'Harry van de Laar'. Hybrid between H. 'June' and H. hypoleuca and has huge leaves of a soft green color with white backs. Rounded leaves have a very nice wavy margin and are topped with lavender flowers.............16.00

**Emerald Ruff Cut [M] (Anderson) Newer sport of H. 'Sea Angel Wings'...nicely ruffled leaves have a beautiful gold center surrounded by an emerald-green border. Vigorous grower with good substance and topped with pale lavender flowers...can be a


Empress Wu [VL] (Skaggs) This is definitely a situation where a picture is worth a thousand words! When folks ask us what's the largest hosta we carry we no longer give it any thought...this seedling of H. 'Big John' and one of the "Xanadu" series from Brian & Virginia Skaggs of FOoSF fame, surpasses all hostas we know. Huge dark green leaves have deeply impressed veins and tremendous substance. In 5 or 6 years a mature clump can reach 4 1/2' tall. Topped with pale lavender flowers on 5' scapes in midsummer...truly a


Enterprise [M] (Q&Z Nursery) New sport from H. 'Captain Kirk' with a creamy-white center and a wide dark green border. Seems to be a good grower for a white centered hosta and has good substance.


Essence of Summer [M] (Jan van den Top) A wonderful

tetraploid sport of H. 'Warwick Essence'...extremely thick, rounded, medium green leaves are a little darker color than the parent and topped with large fragrant white flowers in late summer.

**First Love [L] (Fransen) This new intro is the reverse sport of H. montana 'Aureomarginata' and will grow into a beautiful clump of somewhat shiny, yellow-centered leaves with a green border that shows some streaking to the center. Just like the parent, H. 'First Love' will be an early riser and can use protection from early frosts. Lavender flowers midsummer..........24.00

Forest Fireworks [M] (Randy Goodwin) Very bright light greenish-yellow leaves have a wide yellow to creamy-white border that shows some streaking to the center. Leaf margins are slightly wavy, clump is topped with pale lavender flowers14.00

Fragrant Bouquet [L] (Aden) Apple-green leaves have wide light yellow margins and are topped with very large white flowers that are fragrant. Vigorous grower that is tolerant of some afternoon sun..................9.00

**Fragrant Queen [M/L] (Jan van den Top) Tetraploid sport of H. 'Fragrant King'...thicker leaves, wider creamy-white border and a super "doer"! We are very impressed with the appearance and performance of this plant, holds up well all season and still looks great late in the summer when it is topped with pale lavender fragrant flowers.......(limited, so order early).......35.00











**Frosted Mouse Ears [S] (Deckert) One of the many sports of H. 'Blue Mouse Ears' and this one is superb...thick blue leaves with a wide creamy-white border that turns to white later. Plants offered are small, but have proven to grow very well. Same lavender flowers as the parent.......19.00

**Funky Monkey [M] (Scheer) Unlike any hosta we've seen! It is a medium sized plant that emerges chartreuse with deep red/black petioles, the color extending

high into the leaf veins on the undersides. The petioles are long and the leaves do not cover them, showcasing the deep color. As the season progresses, some leaves turn all gold, some leaf centers turn gold and the edges deepen to a lustrous green, however the irregular borders are unlike any typical variegation. Shiny, good substance, sun tolerance, good growth rate, flowers deeply colored and fertile...it creates exciting babies!.......35.00

**Goldbrook Glory (M/L) (Bond) From Great Britain, this great sport of H. 'Zounds' is thought to be one of Sandra Bond's best introductions. Good substance on a dark green leaf with a bright creamy border that later turns white. Vigorous grower will be topped with lavender flowers.......24.00

<u>Guacamole</u> [L] (Solberg) This outstanding plant does best if planted in a sunnier location...forms a large open mound of gold leaves with dark green margins by the end of the season (in cooler climates it often doesn't show good variegation until late May). Topped with very large fragrant near-white flowers.......12.00

<u>Hacksaw</u> [S] (Livingston) Small, rapidly growing plant with long narrow and tapered leaves that are intensely rippled and serrated. The leaf edge looks dangerous, but the only damage likely to be incurred is to your perceptions of what might previously have been termed "hosta". Truly ground-breaking from a genetic perspective, it's appeal as a "collector's hosta" in no way disputes its garden worthiness. Blooms very late in the season with lavender flowers and is fertile both ways.......16.00 <u>Hadspen Blue</u> [M] (Smith/Aden) TF2x7 Low-growing clump with rounded blue-green leaves of good substance...one of the "bluest" and topped with pale lavender flowers in July............8.00

Arisaema (Jack-in-the Pulpits) are a delightful addition to any shade garden. We carry several Asian varieties from China and Japan, as well as, many from the Himalayas. The unusual flowers consist of a spathe (hooded tube) that surrounds a spadix (which can take many forms) and come in a variety of colors. The foliage is usually very tropical appearing and the plant grows from a corm or tuber. Grow Arisaemas in a moist but well-draining soil that is slightly acidic and rich in humus. They prefer a shaded site and protection from late spring frosts. Flowers usually appear in spring or early summer. Plant the corms about 4-5" deep. Removal of the spent flowers will increase the vigor. Protect from slugs and mulch in the winter. If grown in pots overwatering is the greatest danger. Most Arisaemas are hardy from zone 5-9.



Arisaemas can only be shipped in early spring and not after April 15th.

A. barnesii [Zone 7-9] Found in the mountain rainforests of S. India and Sri Lanka...small to medium sized Arisaema and reaches about 12-14" tall. It has one leaf that is divided into 5-9 leaflets. The spathe, which is held below the foliage, is dark maroon or green with white stripes. Should receive some protection in severe winters.







A. consanguineum [**Zone 5-9**] Quite tall and has a single leaf divided into 12 leaflets. Spathe is purple brown with white stripes held on a "snake-skin" patterned stem.......14.00









A. kishidae 'Jack Frost' [Zone 5-9] Little-known but easy-to-grow Japanese species... this one has been specially selected and tissue-cultured. The spadix is brownish-purple with a rigid hood that drapes over the front and you can barely see the spadix. Epimediums make a fine slow-spreading groundcover, excellent for shade under trees where few other plants will perform. Evergreen to semi-evergreen, leaves often emerge in bright colors in the spring, turn green for the season, and then color up again for the fall. In spring short sprays of star-like flowers appear in various colors. They like fertile soil, often tolerate drier conditions and most are hardy to Zone 5. With the opening of China to Western exploration many new species are finding their way to the US. We are offering several new ones again this year and will have many more to come in the future once quantities become sufficient. Plants listed with a "Cc" number have been acquired from Darrell Probst of Garden Vision, who is the American expert on Epimedium, and identify a particular clone that he has identified and propagated. Although we list most Epimediums as Zone 5 we've heard many success stories with the plant in harsher climates...a good mulch may be the answer.






