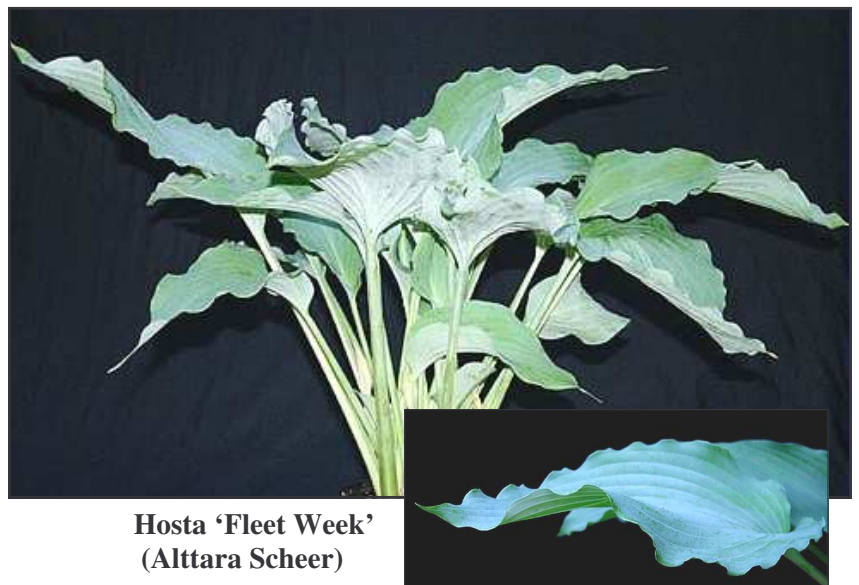
**The 2009 List** will be our 14th mail order catalog! The nursery is almost 20 years old and we definitely claim this has been a long and consuming journey full of great experiences and good friends. A few customers have been there since the beginning, some for several years, and many of you have recently found Naylor Creek Nursery...all are very much appreciated. We hope to continue to bring you the newest and most exciting hostas and other shade tolerant perennials for many more years. We cannot accommodate visitors to the nursery as the "crew" consists of only the two of us and time is always short. Please use the catalog and website to allow us to help fill your gardening needs. You will also find us at several West Coast Flower Shows, many shows and sales throughout the Northwest, and at the Hosta Conventions in their various locations. Again, there are many new **hosta** introductions which means we must continue to trim our list to the number of plants the nursery can hold and we can successfully grow...many older varieties will no longer be available. We are working with a broadening group of great hybridizers so look for many new and exciting introductions from here, in the states, and Europe. **Epimedium** selections continue to increase each year and this will be an ongoing endeavor. Other companion plants also rank high on our priority list but we do offer a wider variety at the shows than in the catalog. Our growing season commences early and we try to grow many things in quart containers which make nice sized plants that can be shipped throughout the season. When ordering, please note if there is an additional shipping fee for certain plants due to weight.

We continue to grow mostly tissue-cultured plants, this allows us to bring production to market at a reasonable price and maintain adequate supplies. Also, tissue-culture aids in the attempt to assure we are providing disease free plants. We, and our suppliers, are testing old and new plant stocks on a regular basis in the hope of accomplishing this goal.

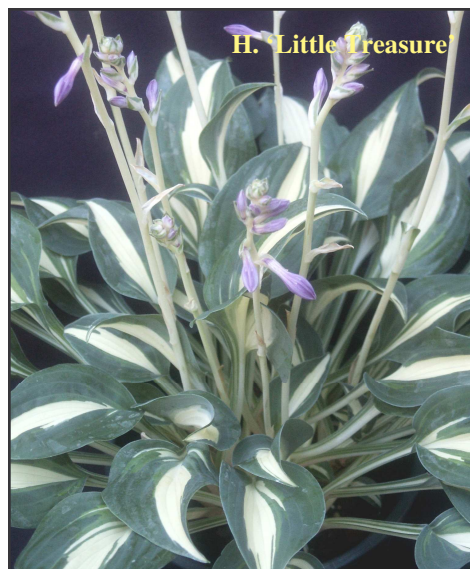

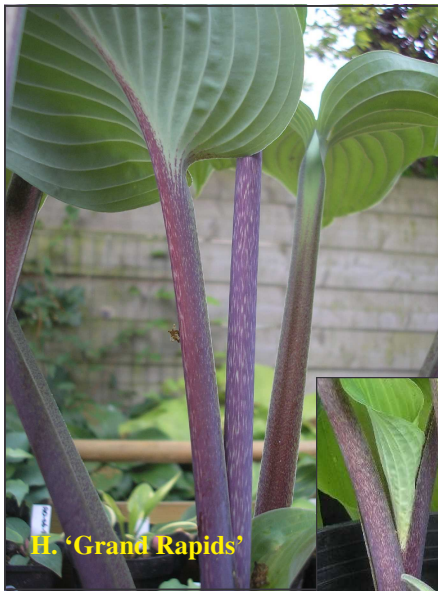
### A word about our plants...

The majority of our plants are grown in containers and have excellent root systems that will re-establish quickly in your landscape. Plants are shipped bare root and, wherever possible, multi-eyed divisions will be sent. We are often asked what size plants we ship...most are from 1-quart to 1-gallon size. In the quest to offer disease free plant material we are selling more and more tissue-cultured stock so if you see a plant listed that has been selling at a very high price and it's listed at a reasonable price, chances are it's tissue-cultured. We now usually sell tissue-cultured plants in their second or third season and find this is generally sufficient time to make sure they're growing well and are true-to-type. We offer many new and rare cultivars of which we have limited supply. Due to growing conditions beyond our control or because of heavy demand for certain plants we advise ordering early. **We will not substitute unless you tell us to do so.** We will always do our best to resolve any problems and also appreciate hearing when you are happy with and have good results with our plants! All plants and the nursery are inspected by Washington State on a regular schedule.

**Hosta Virus X...**In the past couple of years a virus known as **Virus X** has been on the increase in the hosta world and we want you to know we are being very proactive and taking the strongest measures to keep our stock clean. We, and our suppliers, are doing constant testing of new and old plant material and exercising the utmost vigilance in an attempt to make sure you receive clean and healthy stock. The virus makes the plant quite ugly and gives it a very blotchy appearance. These plants should be carefully destroyed. The virus is spread by a cut or a wound that allows the sap to leak from one plant to another often occurring when dividing a plant. Keeping knives and other garden tools quite clean will help considerably to keep from spreading the virus should you have a problem plant and be unaware of it. Most reputable nurseries and garden centers are now becoming educated about the problem but some of the mass outlets that turn thousands of inexpensive plants are showing heavy numbers of infected plants. We feel with education of the growers and the gardening community this problem will be eradicated in the near future. ## Shipping Information and charges...

**All orders will be shipped by Priority Mail. (we no longer use UPS due to cost)**

We ship March 25th through October 15<sup>th</sup>. Earlier or later shipments are possible but prior scheduling is necessary...we will accommodate your needs wherever possible.

**We have had excellent results shipping Priority Mail** and find it opens our shipping schedule to any day of the week. Service has been faster than UPS (even orders to the East Coast arrive in 2-3 days) and the cost is much less expensive. Not only does the Post Office deliver on Saturday, but they also keep mail moving over the weekend.

\*\*\*The Post Office now offers **email notification** of package departure at no extra cost. If you would like us to utilize this service **please provide your email address with your order and you will be notified when your shipment leaves us.** They will also provide you with a tracking number.

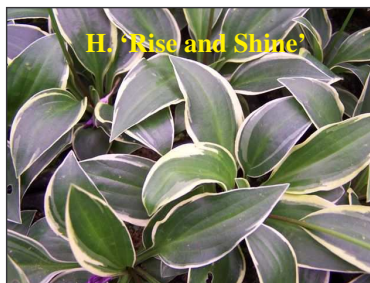
## Payment Information...

**Hostas** are very hardy, adaptable, easy to grow and principally known for their foliage. They come in sizes from miniature to giant, in colors from solids of green, blue or gold or variegations of mixed colors of border and center. Flowers are borne on scapes, some are fragrant, and most all bloom between May and September. They prefer rich, slightly acidic, well-draining soil that retains some moisture and do best in part shade. Hostas can tolerate some sun, morning sun is best and the amount depends on your particular climate...these are shade-tolerant plants not shade-loving. A dormant period is required and is usually brought on by shorter days or first frost in the fall. Propagate by division and best done in early spring as the plant emerges but is not required. They have few diseases and the only significant pests are slugs and snails...we also hear of problems with deer where there are heavy populations. Hostas are low maintenance plants and will truly be a great addition to your garden.

**Hostas** come in a wide range of sizes and as you go through our listing you will see a letter in parenthesis after the name that denotes the height of the plant...the ledger below will help to convert this to inches.  
 [mini]=dwarf 3-6" [S]=small 6-12" [M]=medium 12-24" [L]=large 24-36"

- Abiqua Drinking Gourd** [L] (Walden West) Large blue hosta with very round and puckered leaves that are deeply cupped. Great substance, good color and white flowers make this a desirable specimen .....**10.00**
- Academy Blushing Recluse** [M] (Chamberlain) Large corrugated dark green leaves have a very wide greenish-yellow border. Leaves are somewhat shiny and this vigorous grower is topped with near white flowers in July...makes a stunning clump.....**12.00**
- Academy Devon Moor** [M] (Chamberlain) A vigorous seedling from H. 'Devon Mist'... makes a very dense medium-sized clump of dark green leaves topped with near-white flowers. A great landscape plant for massed plantings.....**15.00**
- Academy Flaxen Spades** [M] (Chamberlain) Seedling from H. 'Vanilla Cream' and a nice gold that resembles a medium-sized version of the parent. The greenish-yellow leaf is spade-shaped and rather flat...topped with pale lavender flowers.....**12.50**
- Academy Flora** [M] (Chamberlain) Vigorous green hosta rapidly increases to produce a somewhat open, small to medium mound with many divisions. Large numbers of pale lavender flowers appear in early summer on short scapes.....**12.00**
- Academy Muse** [M] (Chamberlain) Vigorous medium-sized hosta with green leaves that have a subtle darker green margin when grown in full shade...grow it in partial sun and the center lightens to gold with a green margin and green veins and medium-purple flowers.....**12.00**
- aequinocctiantha** [M] (species) Species with slightly rippled green leaves that are lance shaped... forms an upright clump and is topped with lavender flowers. This is the European strain.....**8.00**
- (longissima) 'Akikaze'** [mini] (Japan) A charming mini from Japan that is found growing on rocks in and around springs and streams. H. 'Akikaze has long narrow green leaves with a narrow creamy-yellow border...topped with lavender flowers.....**14.00**





Brand new from Ron Livingston...

**\*\*Alakazaam PPAF (mini)** (Livingston) Ron says 'Alakazaam' is one of his favorites! An exciting mini with H. 'Atom Smasher' genes gives a completely new look...beautiful green leaves framed by a "ruffled" creamy-white border are electrifying as they dance upward. This vigorous grower is stoloniferous and has above average substance for a smaller plant.....**22.00**

**Alismifolia** [S] (species-Japan) Species from Japan with narrow green leaves that grows in wet sphagnum bogs and marshes" (according to W. George Schmid) in its native land. Lavender flowers.....**9.00**



H. 'Aliyah's Grace'

**Aliyah's Grace** [M] (Asch) Stuart Asch developed this fine plant with slightly shiny, rounded lime-yellow leaves that are heavily corrugated and deeply cupped. The thick leaves also have a slightly wavy margin and are topped with lavender flowers held on red scapes that contrast beautifully. Don't be afraid to put this one out in lots of sun because it can take it and the color will be much more intense.....**18.00**

**Allegan Fog** [S/M] (Herrema) Unique, shiny green leaves have leaf centers of a misty green and white variegation. Topped with lavender flowers. Vigorous and good substance.....**10.00**

**Alligator Shoes** [M] (Benedict/Hatfield) Broad leaf is blue-green with a creamy-white border and a tapered point that twists slightly...develops a pebbled surface by the second year. Good substance and topped with lavender flowers.....**11.00**

**\*\*Amazing Grace** [M/L] (Ward) Large dark green leaves are surrounded by a beautiful wide creamy-white border that is slightly rippled. Good substance and vigorous grower with pale lavender flowers mid summer.....**18.00**

**American Halo** [L] (Van Wade) Chosen for its superior form and beauty...large blue leaves are surrounded by a wide creamy-white margin. Topped with white flowers in early summer.....**12.00**



H. 'American Icon'

**\*\*American Icon PP#17441** [L] (Hansen) A sport from H. 'Choo Choo Train' that produces a very large clump of green leaves with a wide gold edge. Pale lavender flowers top the clump in midsummer. Best grown in a shady location.....**16.00**



H. 'Arctic Blast'

**Ann Kulpa** [M] (Kulpa) Leaf center emerges yellow but changes to creamy-white later in the season and is surrounded by a wide dark green margin. Moderate corrugation and above average substance. Topped with pale lavender flowers.....**12.00**

**Arctic Blast** [M] (Carlson) Monty Carlson brings us a beautiful cool frosted blue hosta that forms an elegant vase-shaped clump of thick leaves. The leaves have lots of ruffles and the tips are twisted...add white undersides and you have a pretty exciting plant. Lavender flowers complete the picture in early summer.....**15.00**

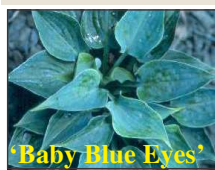
**Aristocrat PP#11286** [M] (Walters Gardens) H. 'Hadspen Blue' with a creamy margin... powder-blue leaves are surrounded with a creamy-yellow to white margin and create a very impressive plant Topped with light lavender flowers.....**10.00**

**Atlantis PP#17,093,PVR** [L] (Hansen) H. 'Atlantis is a tetraploid of H. Abba Dabba Do and makes a huge clump of thick wavy green leaves surrounded by a wide yellow border. The pointed leaves are topped with lavender flowers in midsummer Stunning!..... **16.00**



H. 'Awakening Angel'

**\*\*Awakening Angel** [M] (Nyikos) A hybrid from H. 'Mikawa-no-yuki that makes a dense clump of very blue, flat spear-shaped leaves that are topped with pale lavender flowers in late summer.....**25.00**



'Baby Blue Eyes'

**Baby Blue Eyes** [mini/small] (Solberg) Very blue, heart-shaped leaves form a showy, flat clump with a tight growing habit. Great substance and lavender flowers on 8-10" scapes. Grows well and looks great.....**15.00**

**Barbara Ann** [L] (Muntions Microplants) Nice H. sieboldiana 'Elegans' sport ...beautiful wide white border surrounds a nicely rounded and corrugated blue leaf with great substance. Differs from H. 'Northern Exposure. Topped with white flowers.....**15.00**



H. 'Barbara Ann'

**Barbara May** [M] (Solberg) Newer intro from Bob Solberg with many great attributes...beautiful blue color with lots of white wax on both sides of the triangular-shaped leaves. Makes a ruffled blue clump topped with pale lavender flowers and holds it's good looks right up to the end of the season.....**20.00**

**Beckoning PP18371** [L] (Saville) A H. 'Blue Angel' sport with gold leaves framed by a wide blue-green border...variegation does not show until early summer and then intensifies slowly and is well defined by the end of the season. The huge heart-shaped leaves are somewhat cupped and topped with white flowers.....**12.50**

**Bedazzled** [S] (Don Dean) From Don Dean of Minnesota...makes a small clump of blue-green leaves framed by a wide yellow-gold margin which later changes to a dark green center and greenish yellow margin. Great substance and some cupping on slightly corrugated leaves that are topped with lavender flowers midsummer.....**15.00**



**Bedford Blue** [M] (Chrystal) This unique blue is from Europe and is a cross between H. *hypoleuca* and H. 'Halcyon'...beautiful, pointed, chalky blue leaves are topped with lavender flowers.....**14.00**

**Big Daddy** [L] (Aden) Chalky-blue leaves are rounded, cupped and puckered at maturity...compact growing habit and looks great with gold plants. Topped with white flowers in late spring. Remains one of our favorites.....**8.00**

**Bitsy Gold [mini]** (Savory) Great little gold with very narrow and elongated leaves. Lavender flowers late.....**7.00**

**\*\*Blaze of Glory** [M/L] (Elslager) A bright lemony-gold hosta that lights up in any garden...slightly wavy leaves are topped with near-white flowers in July. Great substance and vivid color make this a desirable specimen.....**16.00**

**Blue Angel** [L] (Aden) Very large, heavy-textured blue-green leaves form a clump which commands attention...probably the largest "blue" grown. Evenly textured leaves and white flowers create a magnificent specimen.....**10.00**

**Blue Chip** [S] (Benedict/Olson) Forms a charming petite clump of heart shaped blue leaves of good substance. Pale lavender flowers come very late in the season and are held quite close.....**14.00**

**Blue Clown** [S] (Benedict/Stratton) Wonderful blue hybrid created by Dr. Benedict from a selfed H. 'Dorset Blue' seedling. Thick leaves are an intense blue-green and form a dense mound topped with pale lavender flowers in July.....**14.00**



**Blue Flame** [M] (Naylor Creek Nursery) Variegated sport of H. 'Fragrant Blue'...smooth heart-shaped leaves are medium blue-green and framed by a variable yellow border. Topped with near-white flowers. Although the parent is said to be fragrant we do not believe H. 'Blue Flame' to be fragrant. Possibly the same as H. 'Secret Love'.....**16.00**

**Blue Hawaii** [L] (Petryszyn) Vigorous blue hosta with an upright habit that can reach 30" tall. Leaves are nicely corrugated, but flat, and hold their color well throughout the season. Topped with pure white flowers.....**15.00**

**Blue Ice [mini]** (Benedict) Good substance on a small blue...heart-shaped leaves topped with lavender flowers.....**10.00**

**\*\*Blue Ivory PPAF** [M] (Klinkhamer) A new and very showy sport of H. 'Halcyon' with thick blue leaves framed by a very wide creamy-yellow border in spring that later turns to white. Topped with lavender flowers in mid summer.....**16.00**



**\*\*Blue Lollipop [mini]** (Benedict) Great little hybrid from H. 'Dorset Blue'...deep blue-green heart-shaped leaves have tremendous substance and are topped with pale lavender flowers.....**14.00**

**Blue Mouse Ears [mini/small]** (Deckert) Wonderful blue with very thick round leaves that forms a tight mound. One of the best and will be topped lavender flowers midseason.....**10.00**

**Blue My Mind** [M] (Gowan) This new H. 'Dorset Clown' hybrid is quite vigorous and forms a dense mound rapidly. Leathery, chalky-blue leaves are heart-shaped and slightly rippled. Near white flowers appear in early summer.....**16.00**

**Blueberry Tart** [S] (Solberg) Small blue cross between H. 'Blue Cadet' and H. 'Fall Bouquet'...intense blue foliage has a distinctive folded leaf shape. Makes a cute, tight mound and blooms in July with small pinkish-purple flowers.....**18.00**

**Bodacious Blue** [L] (Goodwin/Hiland/Whitmore) This H. *sieboldiana* seedling is a huge blue hosta that has a vigorous growth rate and makes a tall handsome clump. Long pointed blue-green leaves are topped with near white flowers.....**14.00**

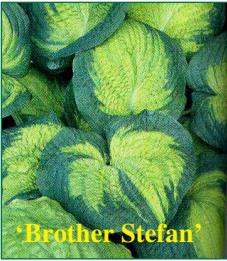
**Bold and Brassy** [L] (Seaver) Wonderful golden crinkled leaves have great substance and an impressive appearance...lavender flowers appear midseason.....**15.00**

**Border Favourite** [S] (Jan van den Top) Unique sport of H. 'Little Aurora'...thick round leaf is very dark green surrounded by a good yellow margin. ....**15.00**

**Grey Ghost** [M/L] (Solberg) Unique sport of H. ‘Blue Angel’...in spring the leaves emerge creamy-white with very little color, then turn a bright butter-yellow and eventually blue in about six weeks. Near white flowers in June.....**16.00**

**Guacamole** [L] (Solberg) This outstanding plant does best if planted in a sunnier location...forms a large open mound of gold leaves with dark green margins by the end of the season (in cooler climates it often doesn’t show good variegation until late May). # ADDITIONAL

## Shade Tolerant Perennials

**Arisaema** (Jack-in-the Pulpits) are a delightful addition to any shade garden. We carry several Asian varieties from China and Japan, as well as, many from the Himalayas. The unusual flowers consist of a spathe (hooded tube) that surrounds a spadix (which can take many forms) and come in a variety of colors. The foliage is usually very tropical appearing and the plant grows from a corm or tuber. Grow Arisaemas in a moist but well-draining soil that is slightly acidic and rich in humus. They prefer a shaded site and protection from late spring frosts. Flowers usually appear in spring or early summer. Plant the corms about 4-5" deep. Removal of the spent flowers will increase the vigor. Protect from slugs and mulch in the winter. If grown in pots overwatering is the greatest danger. Most Arisaemas are hardy from zone 5-9.

**Arisaemas can only be shipped in early spring and not after April 15th.**



*A. album*

**A. album** [Zone 7-9] One of the smaller varieties of Arisaema from Northeastern India and quite unusual. Green trifoliate leaves create a clump that gets about 1' tall. The flower comes in June with a brush-like spadix. The name "album" comes from the white patch at the back of the green spathe where the hood folds down.....**18.00**



*A. barnesii*

**A. barnesii** [Zone 7-9] Found in the mountain rainforests of S. India and Sri Lanka...small to medium sized Arisaema and reaches about 12-14" tall. It has one leaf that is divided into 5-9 leaflets. The spathe, which is held below the foliage, is dark maroon or green with white stripes. Should receive some protection in severe winters.....**15.00**



*A. costatum*

**A. concinnum** [Zone 6-9] One of the prettiest in the genus and has a single radiate leaf which carries 7-11 leaflets. The spathe is pure green or dark purple with 5 broad vertical white stripes. Found growing in humusy soil on temperate forest floors and will do well in woodland gardens. Flowers in May and June.....**10.00**



*A. concinnum*

**A. consanguineum** [Zone 5-9] Quite tall and has a single leaf divided into 12 leaflets. Spathe is purple brown with white stripes held on a "snake-skin" patterned stem.....**14.00**

**A. costatum** [Zone 6-9] Native to central and eastern Nepal and has a leaf divided into 3 leaflets...gets its name from the exaggerated ribs on the undersides of the leaflets. The spathe is dark purple with white stripes. Flowers in early June.....**14.00**

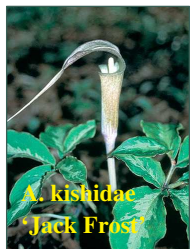

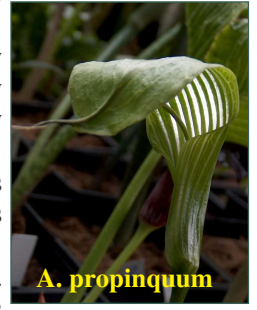

**A. speciosum** [Zone 6-8] Native to the Himalayas and best attempted in mild climates as does not do well in too much heat. The dark reddish to purple striped spathe is very attractive and held under one leaf divided into 3 segments. Needs sharp drainage but also moisture so a little tricky to find the right spot.....10.00

**A. speciosum var Magnificum** [Zone 6-9] Magnificum is a very large selection of A. speciosum and a magnificently stunning plant. Flowers and leaves are similar but just a lot larger.....12.00

**A. speciosum var. mirable** [Zone 6-9] This plant differs from above in that it flowers much later and the spadix is considerably thicker at the base where it protrudes from the spathe. Flowers in late spring to early summer.....18.00

**A. tortuosum** [Zone 6-9] From the Himalayas and can grow to be quite tall...the two leaves are divided into many long narrow leaflets and are topped with a green spathe. The spadix is quite long and extends up and out like a buggy whip reaching for an unfound target. Blooms in late spring.....9.00

**A. urashima** [Zone 5-9] This arisaema has one tall leaf divided into 11-15 leaflets...purple spathe with a hood that hangs down in front of it with a "whip" that can reach 18" long. Originates from Japan.....14.00

**A. utile** [Zone 5-9] One of the prettier in the genus and has a single trifoliate leaf that is green with maroon veining. The spathe is cobra-like with a maroon hood that has white stripes and is held below the leaf. **Epimediums** make a fine slow-spreading groundcover, excellent for shade under trees where few other plants will perform. Evergreen to semi-evergreen, leaves often emerge in bright colors in the spring, turn green for the season, and then color up again for the fall. In spring short sprays of star-like flowers appear in various colors. They like fertile soil, often tolerate drier conditions and most are hardy to Zone 5. With the opening of China to Western exploration many new species are finding their way to the US. We are offering several new ones again this year and will have many more to come in the future once quantities become sufficient. Plants listed with a “Cc” number have been acquired from Darrell Probst of Garden Vision, who is the American expert on Epimedium, and identify a particular clone that he has identified and propagated. Although we list most Epimediums as Zone 5 we’ve heard many success stories with the plant in harsher climates...a good mulch may be the answer.

- E. alpinum** [12”] Good variety for an area with dry shade...small red and yellow flowers, nice foliage. Spreads to form a groundcover and will be semi-evergreen. Z5.....**6.00**
- E. alpinum ‘Shrimp Girl’** [8”] (Cc930006) A selected form of *E. alpinum* with a much tighter growth habit. Z5.....**6.00**

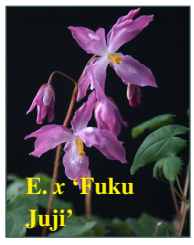

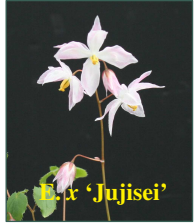

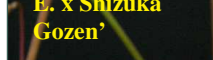
