Dear President Spicci:

The Association of State Wetland Managers, Inc. (ASWM) endorses the National States Geographic Information Council's "Imagery for the Nation" initiative. ASWM supports the initiative in recognition of the critical role that accurate upto-date imagery provides the public and private sector. Imagery in conjunction with the GIS systems it supports is essential to providing information to help guide the complex decisions that are undertaken on a daily basis by federal, state, and local governments as well as private and nonprofit organizations.

Currently multiple entities are purchasing digital imagery at varying scales on a piecemeal and duplicative basis; if it is being purchased at all. For example most wetland maps in the United States have not been updated since the original photography was taken in the 1970's and 1980's. Currently the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service receives resources for mapping or re-mapping only 2% of the nation's wetlands each year. Imagery of wetlands and many other critical data layers will become increasingly out of date unless there is a sustained effort to make accurate, current imagery available and in the public domain. Individual units of government cannot bear the sustained costs of achieving this goal.

If anything, the NSGIC initiative does not go far enough. Critical data layers such as wetlands and impervious surfaces require Color Infrared Aerial Photography (CIR) for interpreting and providing accurate reliable maps. This is part of the buy-up option outlined in the initiative. ASWM believes that there is a real need, not only for the imagery outlined in the initiative, but also for long term funding for CIR and perhaps other buy up components as well.

The Imagery for the Nation initiative is, from our standpoint a "bare bones" initiative, an important and necessary first step. We look forward to opportunities to further support the acquisition of imagery critical to the nation.
