POPULATION SERVED/RECRUITMENT: The Project will serve a minimum of 84 participants over a two year period of performance concluding March 31, 2010. The Statement of Work does not clearly articulate how the participants will be identified and recruited for the JUMPSTART project. Nonetheless, it does relate that all participants will undertake personal and vocational assessments to ascertain each participant's appropriateness in the program.

BRIEF DESCRIPTION: The JUMPSTART project will provide case management and mentoring services to support the participants. JUMPSTART is a bilingual vocational training program that teaches the basics of food handler's competencies so participants can obtain a Food Handler Certificate. The Community Intervention Associates - the subgrantee - will provide services to returning prisoners including workforce development services, job training, work experience, basic skills remediation, counseling and case management.

NON-FEDERAL MATCH: The Statement of Work does not indicate a non-federal match leveraged to support this project.
