

Lespedeza capitata

Round-headed Bush Clover



An upright, stiffish plant with creamy-white or pinkish-white clusters of flowers. Dried seedheads are attractive in the winter. Good for dry sites. An important food plant for bobwhite quail.

Suggested companions: switch grass (*Panicum virgatum*), other grasses, smooth aster (*Aster laevis*), old-field goldenrod (*Solidago nemoralis*), other goldenrods.
