
Habitat: Found moist sites, sometimes by watersides, in regions with hot summers and cold to mild winters.

General Description: White Poplar grows to a height of 60-100 feet with a 40-50 foot spread. The dark-green, lobed leaves have a fuzzy, white underside which gives the tree a sparkling effect when breezes stir the leaves.

Distinctive Characteristics: The bark is smooth and grayish-white, with characteristic diamond-shaped dark marks.

Growth Habit: Tree

Distribution: Found throughout the United States
