In case you are new to the world of electronic filing, ECF was developed by the federal judiciary to provide to federal courts nationwide the capability to store court documents in electronic format, accept electronic filings and enhance case management. ECF allows attorneys to file and view documents from their office, home or anywhere they have access to the Internet, 24 hours a day. Documents are automatically docketed as part of the filing process and are immediately available electronically. Links to orders issued by the court are sent via email as soon as the order is filed.
