NATIONAL EGG REVIEW



At the beginning of the week the New York prices were slightly lower for extra large and large and unchanged for medium. Other reported prices were sharply lower for the larger sizes and unchanged for the lighter weight eggs. During the week the New York prices were lower for the larger sizes and unchanged for medium. Other reported prices were unchanged with asking prices for next week trending sharply lower for larger sizes. The trade sentiment was weak for the larger sizes and mostly steady for the lighter weight eggs. Retail demand was light to mostly moderate. Food service movement was mostly light. Supplies were fully adequate to ample for the larger sizes and usually adequate for mediums. Breaking stock prices were slightly lower during the week with checks and undergrades lower. Demand was mostly moderate to at times fairly good for the adequate to available offerings. Floor stocks were adequate to fully adequate. Processing schedules were full-time. The trade sentiment was barely steady. North Central regional light hen removal costs continued unchanged. Offerings were adequate for the light to moderate demand. Processing schedules were full-time. The trade sentiment remains steady.

PRICES TO RETAILERS, SALES TO VOLUME BUYERS, USDA GRADE A AND GRADE A, WHITE EGGS IN CARTONS, PRICES DELIVERED TO WAREHOUSE, CENTS PER DOZEN.

MIDWEST REGIONAL Producer prices were lower for large and unchanged for the balance. Midwest delivered prices were unchanged with asking prices for next week trending sharply lower for the larger sizes and unchanged for medium. Trade sentiment was weak for the larger sizes and about steady for medium. Retail demand was light to moderate. Food service movement was slow. Supplies were ample for the larger sizes and adequate for medium. Central states breaking stock prices were unchanged to lower with checks and undergrades lower. Demand was moderate to fairly good for the adequate offerings. Floor stocks adequate to fully adequate. Schedules full-time. Trade sentiment barely steady.

NORTHEAST REGIONAL Prices were unchanged. Trade sentiment was barely steady to weak on larger sizes, generally steady in mediums. Demand was moderate. Current supplies were at least adequate to available for buyer and seller requirements. Eastern Region breaking stock floor stocks were sufficient to fully sufficient for normal schedules. Spent hens were more than adequate for a moderate demand.

WEEKLY FRYERS AVAILABLE FOR MARKETING

Based on the preliminary chick placements, the number of fryers available for marketing during the week ending 25-Oct-08 is estimated at 156.6 million head. This compares to 155.9 million head the previous week and to 166.3 million head the same week a year ago, when the slaughter was 169.6 million head and the composite weighted average price was 71.21 cents per pound.






