Thomas B. Alexander, J.D., has served as Chief of Staff of the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, since April 2002. Prior to that, he was Legislative Director to U.S. Senator Jon Kyl (R-AZ) (2001-2002) and served as a policy advisor to Senator Kyl on health issues arising before the Senate Judiciary and Senate Finance Committees (1995 to 2002); served as legislative aide for health in the office of U.S. Representative Jim McCrery (R-LA) (1993); and as a Special Assistant to the Assistant Secretary and Deputy Assistant Secretary of what was then the Pension and Welfare Benefits Administration at the U.S. Department of Labor (1992). From 1987 to 1992, he was an Assistant City Attorney in Kansas City, Missouri handling business license and earnings tax prosecutions. An 1987 graduate of the University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Law, he was a member of the Honor Court and Moot Court, was selected for an Academic Clerkship in the Chambers of Pasco Bowman II, 8th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals (1987), and clerked for the Kansas City office of William Webster, Missouri Attorney General (1986-1987). He was a writer in the Reagan White House Office of Correspondence (1981-1983), and was honorably discharged from Platoon Leaders Class, United States Marine Corp at Quantico (1977-1979). He graduated Summa Cum Laude from Cardinal Newman College, St. Louis, in 1981.
