FEDERAL RULE OF APPELLATE PROCEDURE 25 HAS BEEN AMENDED.

FEDERAL CIRCUIT RULE CHANGES:

- Rule 32.1 was adopted in response to Fed. R. App. P. 32.1, which allows the citation of nonprecedential dispositions issued after January 1, 2007. Federal Circuit Rule 47.6 prohibited the citation of nonprecedential dispositions and has been deleted.
- Rule 47.3 applies to attorneys representing the government. The rule has been revised to provide that government officials who are listed on a brief in their ex officio capacity by reason of their status as supervisor or head of an office need not enter an appearance.

COURT OF APPEALS MISCELLANEOUS FEE SCHEDULE

- On September 19, 2006, the Judicial Conference approved several changes to the Court of Appeals Miscellaneous Fee Schedule to become effective January 1, 2007.
- On March 11, 2008, the Judicial Conference amended the Electronic Public Access Fee Schedule.
