TESTING RESTRICTION You may not test for this classification more than once in a 12 month period. If you have taken an examination for this classification with the Department of Mental Health, Atascadero, Coalinga, Metropolitan, Napa or Patton State Hospitals or with Salinas Valley or Vacaville Psychiatric Programs, within the last 12 months, you are not eligible to compete in this examination.

EXAM PLAN

This examination will consist of a Qualifications Appraisal Interview only, weighted 100.00%. In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70.00% must be attained in the interview. This is an open examination. Applications will not be accepted on a promotional basis.

QUALIFICATIONS APPRAISAL PANEL It is anticipated that interviews will be held during March or April, 2008.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

NOTE: All competitors must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination by the application deadline date.

Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the requirements stated below include more than one pattern and are distinguished as "Either" I, "or" II, "or" III, etc. For example, candidates possessing qualifying experience amounting to 50% of the required time of Pattern I, and additional experience amounting to 50% of the required time of Pattern II, may be admitted to an examination as meeting 100% of the overall experience requirement.

Either I

Two years of experience in the California state service performing the duties of a Cook Specialist I.

Or II

- Three years of experience as a cook in one or a combination of the following:
 Preparing food for at least 250 persons a meal with experience at the various stations, not less than six months of which shall have been in charge of the work of kitchen helpers or others doing similar work.
- 2. Personally preparing complete breakfasts, lunches, and dinners for 50 or more persons a meal. (Short-order cooking experience is not considered qualifying).

(Full – time training in a recognized trade school for cooks and bakers may be substituted for not more than two years of either type of the required experience on the basis of one month of such school attendance being equal to two months of experience).

SPECIAL PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS

Sympathetic understanding of and willingness to work with resident population of State institutions; personal cleanliness good sense of smell and taste; and freedom from communicable diseases.

JOB DESCRIPTION

Under supervision, prepare, cook, and dispense food for the residents and employees of a State institutional; care for culinary equipment, supplies, and work areas; supervise, instruct, and work with employees and helpers from the resident population; may instruct, lead, or supervise inmates, wards or resident workers and do other related work.

POSITION LOCATION (S) Position exists at Coalinga State Hospital.

It is an objective of the state of California to achieve a drug-free workplace. Any applicant for state employment will be expected to behave in accordance with this objective because the use of illegal drugs is inconsistent with the law of the state, the rules governing civil service, and the special trust placed in public servants.

EXAM INFORMATION

In addition to evaluating the competitors' relative abilities as demonstrated by quality and breadth of experience, emphasis in the examining interview will be on measuring competitively, relative to job demands, each competitor's:

Knowledge of:

- Principles, procedures, and equipment used in the storage, care, preparation, cooking and dispensing of food in large quantity.
- Kitchen sanitation and safety measures used in the operation, cleaning, and care of utensils, equipment, and work areas.
- 3. Food handling sanitation.
- 4 Food values as well as nutritional and economical substitutions within food groups
- Principles of effective supervision and instructing and working with assistants and helpers from the resident population. 5.
- Food accounting and keeping records and preparing reports.

Ability to:

- Communicate at a level required for successful job performance.
- Prepare and cook all food groups and use appropriate equipment.
- 3. Judge food quality
- 4. 5. Plan work schedule and prepare and follow menus, recipes, and formulas.
- Determine food quantities necessary for groups of varying size.
- Instruct and work with assistants and helpers from the resident population.
- Keep records and prepare reports.
- Analyze situations accurately and adopt an effective course of action.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION The resulting eligible list will be used to fill vacancies at Coalinga State Hospital only. The list will be in effect for a minimum of 12 months. It will be abolished after 48 months or the completion of a subsequent examination, whichever comes first.

VETERANS PREFERENCE Veterans Preference credit will be added to the final score of all competitors who are successful in this examination and who qualify for, and have requested these points. Due to changes in the law, which were effective January 1, 1996, VETERANS WHO HAVE ACHIEVED PERMANENT CIVIL SERVICE STATUS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE VETERANS CREDIT.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For an examination without a written feature it is the competitor's responsibility to contact the Examination Unit at the testing facility three weeks after the application deadline date if she/he has not received a progress notice.

If a competitor's notice of oral interview or performance test fails to reach her/him prior to the day of the interview due to a verified postal error, she/he will be

Applications are available at the State Personnel Board, local offices of the Employment Development Department, the location(s) noted on this bulletin, and accessible on the internet at http://www.spb.ca.gov in the state application location.

If you meet the requirements stated on this bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirements does not assure a place on the eligible list. Competitors who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

The Department of Mental Health reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

Examination Locations: When a written test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of competitors and conditions warrant. Ordinarily oral interviews are scheduled at the spot location of the examination; however, locations of interviews may be extended as conditions warrant.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) subdivisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multidepartmental promotional, 4) servicewide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on this bulletin.

Promotional Examinations Only: Competition is limited to employees who have a permanent civil service appointment. Under certain circumstances other employees may be allowed to compete under provisions of Rules 234, 235, and 235.2. State Personnel Board Rules 233, 235, 235.2, and 237 contain provisions regarding civil service status and eligibility for promotional examinations. These rules may be reviewed at departmental personnel office or at the State Personnel Board.

General Qualifications: Competitors must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment record and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Interview Scope: If an interview is conducted, in addition to the scope described on the other side of this bulletin, the panel will consider education, experience, personal development, personal traits and fitness. In appraising experience, more weight will be given to the breadth and recency of pertinent experience and evidence of the competitor's ability to accept and fulfill increasing responsibilities than to the length of her/his experience. Evaluation of a competitor's personal development will include consideration of her/his recognition of her/his training need; her/his plans for self-development; and the progress she/he has made in her/his efforts toward self-development.

Veterans' Preference: Veterans, widows, widowers, and the spouse of a disabled veteran may qualify for veterans' preference credits in Open entrance examinations (15 points for disabled veteran; 10 points for other veterans). Applicable points will be added to the final score of all candidates who are successful in this examination, and who qualify for, and have requested these points. Due to changes in the law, which were effective January 1, 1996, CURRENT CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE ACHIEVED PERMANENT CIVIL SERVICE STATUS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE VETERANS' PREFERENCE CREDITS. Directions on how to apply for veterans' preference credits are on the Veterans' Preference Application Form (Form 1093) which is available from State Personnel Board Offices, written test proctors, and the Department of Veterans Affairs, P.O. Box 942895, Sacramento, CA 94295-0001.

High School Equivalence: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways; 1) passing the General Education Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college-level work; 3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the competitor is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; or 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.
