Fatalities, Entrapments and Serious Accident Summary for 2004

The following data indicate the fatalities and major accidents in calendar year 2004. It includes serious vehicle accidents, fatalities, burn-over/entrapments and injuries associated with wildland and prescribed fire operations. The information was collected by the NWCG Safety & Health Working Team, with confirmation of the fatalities from the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).

The following is a brief summary of the type of accidents experienced in 2004.

Driving: 8 accidents involving 21 personnel with 5 fatalities

Heart Attacks: 9 fatal heart attacks, 2 associated with the Work Capacity Test (WCT) and 7 related to firefighting.

Prescribed Fire: 4 accidents occurred on prescribed fires involving 6 firefighters with 1 fatality.

Aviation: 3 aviation accidents occurred; 2 single engine air tankers (SEAT) and 1 helicopter for a total of 3 fatalities.

Wildland: Wildland firefighting experienced 6 burnovers/ entrapments with 12 shelters deployed involving 44 personnel with 1

fatality.

Timely reporting of burnovers/entrapments and fatalities is necessary. Completion of the Wildland Fire Entrapment/Fatality Initial Report (NFES 0869) accomplishes this need. This initial report is self explanatory and does not replace agency reporting or investigative responsibilities, policies or procedures.
