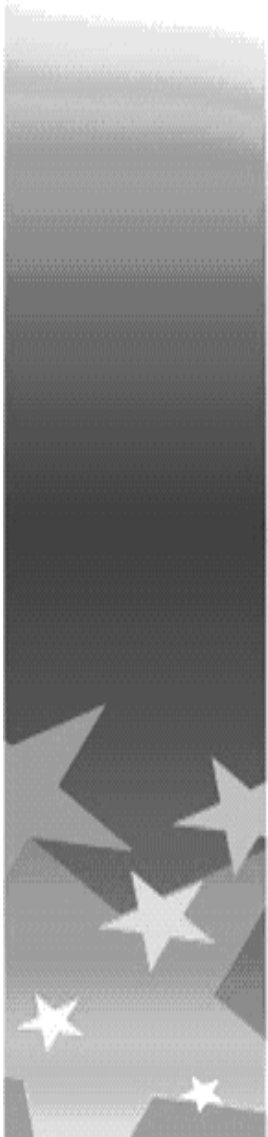
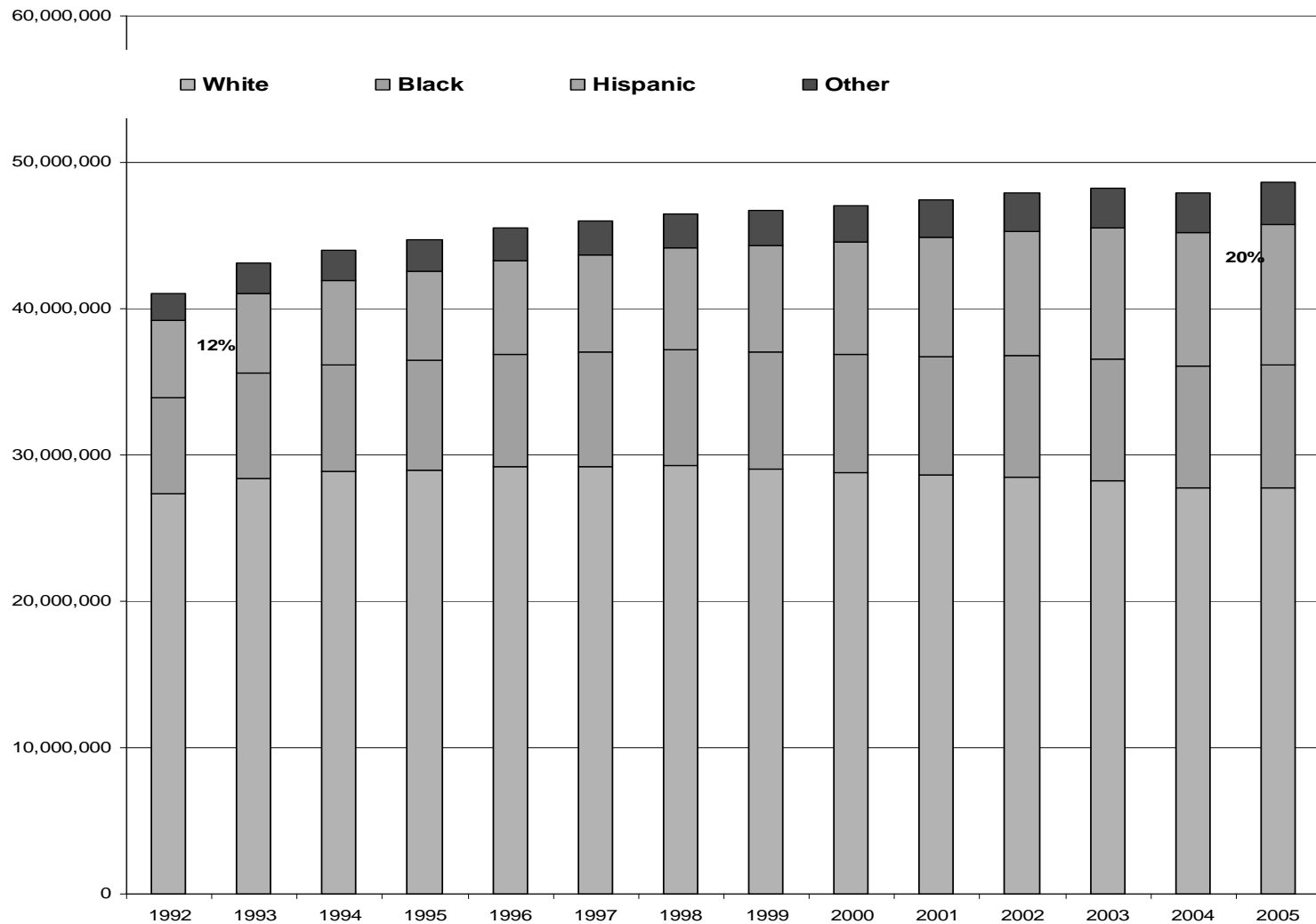


Hispanic Student Enrollment Today 2005-2006

- **Hispanics are 20% of all students**

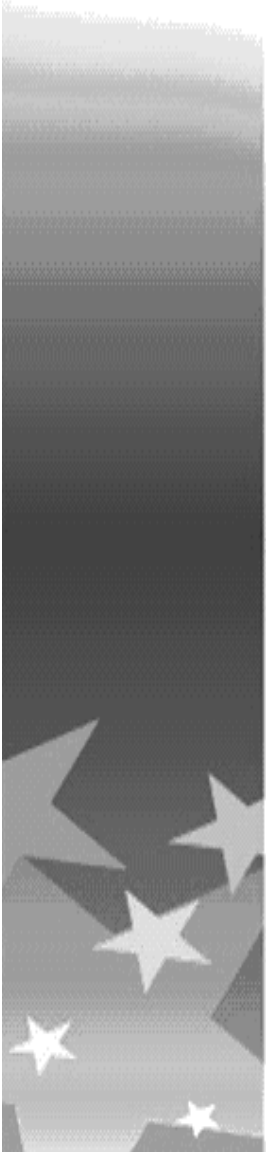


U.S. Public Education Enrollment by Race 1992-2005

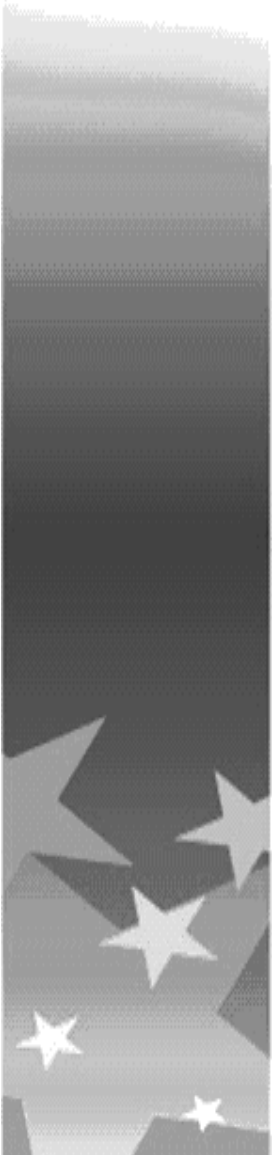

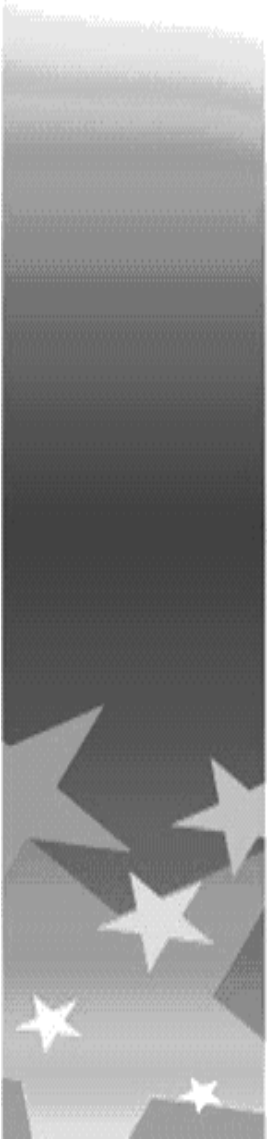
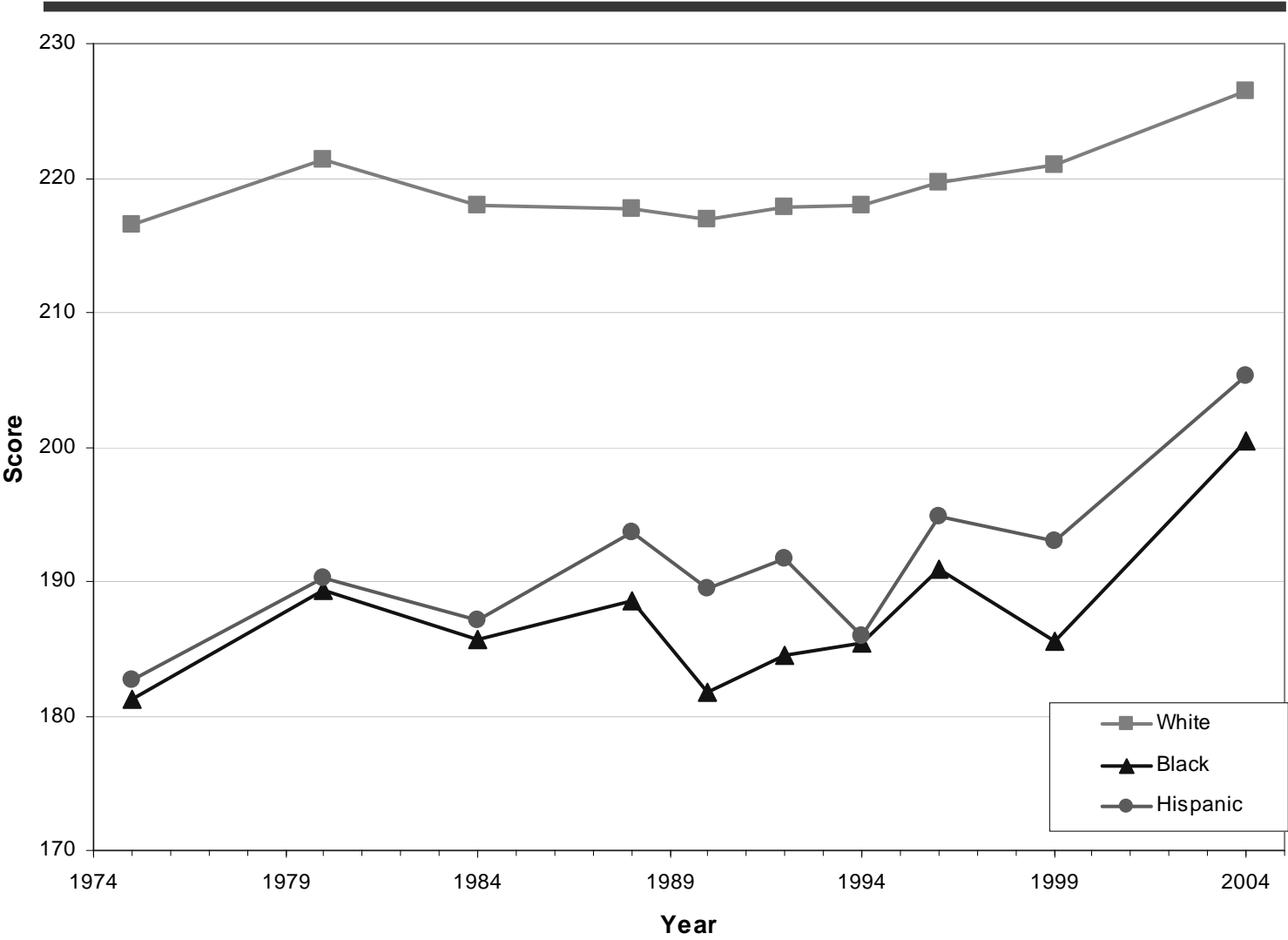
- **By 2023, minorities will comprise more than half of all children**
- **By 2050, 39% of children will be Hispanic and they will be the largest ethnic group in our schools**



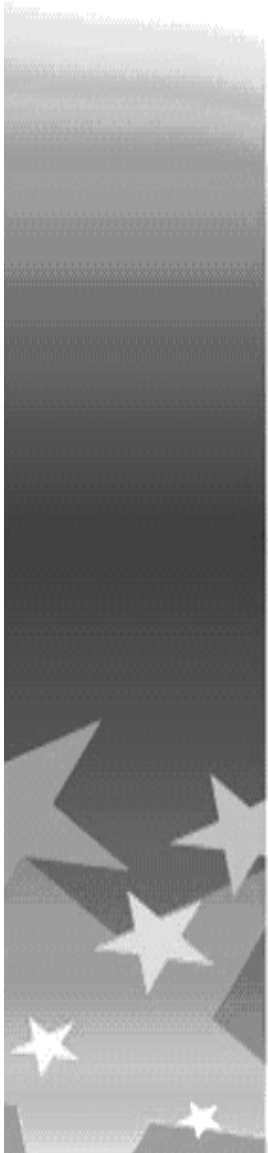
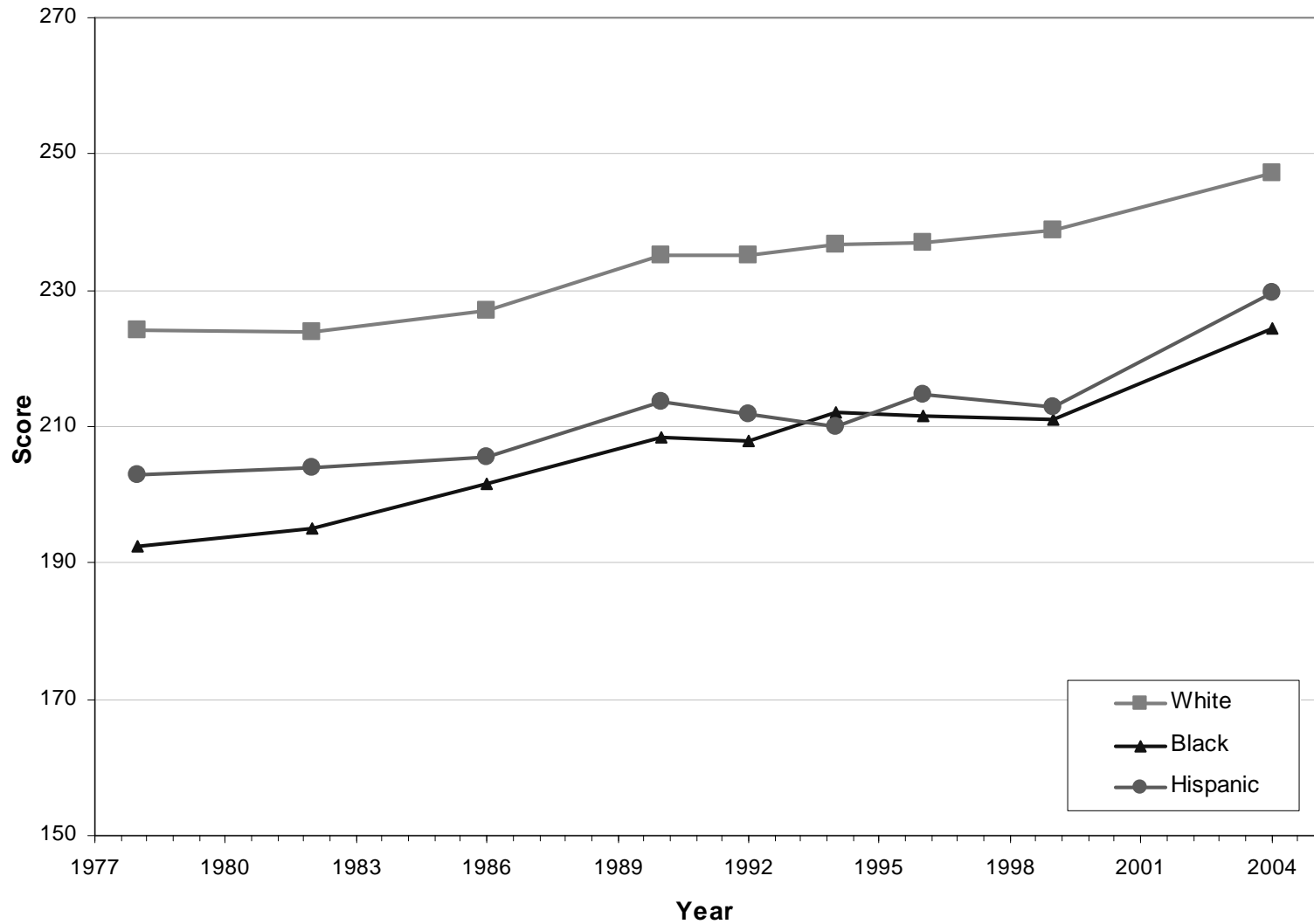

LT NAEP Math Scores for 9 Year-Olds 1978–2004



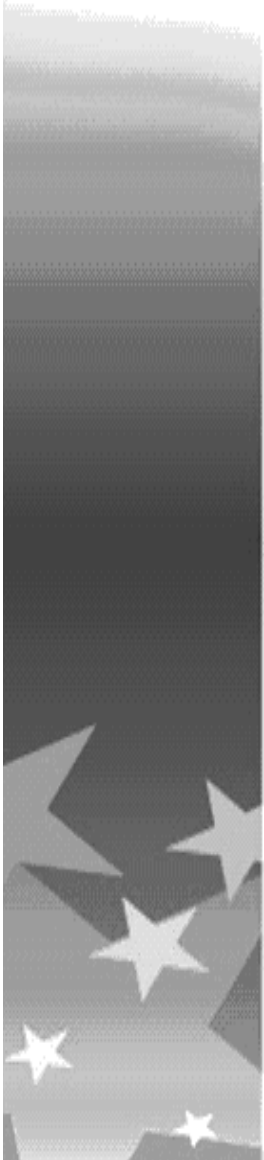

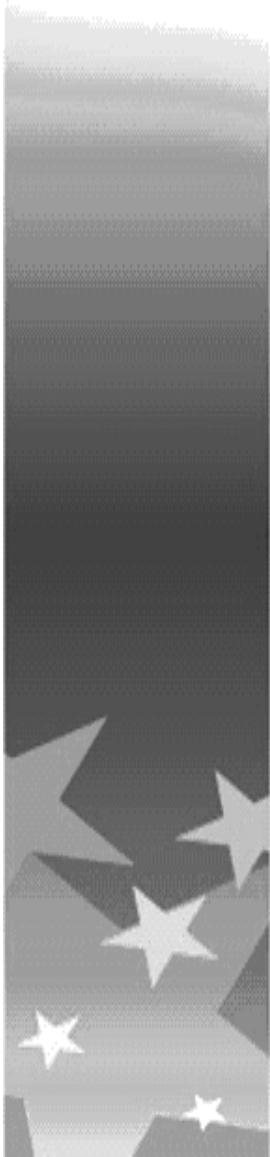

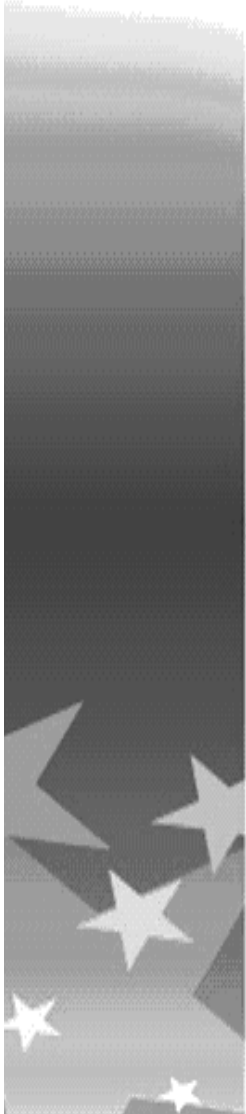
