• According to the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, Hidalgo ECHS is the only open enrollment high school in the nation to serve all students through an Early College High School program.


Hidalgo Early College High School

- Hidalgo ECHS Organization:
 - ECHS is organized into two Academies:
 - Academy of Health, Science, and Technology
 - Academy of Human Services
- Hidalgo ECHS Course Matrix:
 - Freshman and Sophomore year is comprised of traditional, AP, and college courses where students can earn up to 21 college hours.
 - Junior and Senior year is comprised of college coursework where every student will have the opportunity to earn up to 60 college hours upon graduation.

• Counseling Services:


- Assign students to counselors based on selected career pathway and not grade level or alpha designations.

- 2006-2007: Hidalgo ISD School Board was one of only five school boards in Texas to receive the TASA/TASB Honor Board Award.


School Board Support
