What are the outcomes?

- Enriching Children
 - More that 3,000 children receive high quality early childhood education annually
 - Children are ready to learn by the time they enter Pre-K
- Strengthening Families
 - Parents feel more competent and self-esteem increases
 - Families are prepared to become partners in education upon entering the public school system

What are the outcomes?

Creating Public Awareness

 30% of the parents who watched Parents As First Teachers PSA's reported actually reading singing and talking to their babies in full sentences as reported by Peggy Conlon, CEO of the Advertising Council. In their years of tracking, they had not seen this kind of behavior change.

Encouraging Future Leadership

- 500 working adults, primarily from the Hispanic community, have graduated with Master and Doctoral degrees.
- 150 are currently enrolled at El Valor university cohorts at El Valor centers, in the community.
- By December 2010, El Valor and our partner university will have graduated more than 50 MBA's of Hispanic origin.
 - El Valor recently started it's fifth MBA cohort program and a sixth will begin in February 2009





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
