Wall Street Journal Article

Our Disability Affinity Group received an email pertaining to an article, "Workplace Disabilities Are on the Rise," from the Wall Street Journal, 5/1/07, looking at the increase in disabilities among American workers. Many of the concerns regarding employees with disabilities can be related to volunteers and service members in national service programs.

Disabilities among American workers are on the rise. The article discusses how unhealthy lifestyles, increased filings for disability claims for mental health issues, and higher disability claim rates among women workers have resulted in the need for more and more employers to instill accommodation practices in the culture and policies of their workplaces.

A growing number of companies are offering greater scheduling flexibility, and are providing assistive equipment for employees with disabilities on the job. A Sylvania manager stated, "In the future, there will be more pressure on employers to... keep as many people at work as you can." Another quote from the article is from Robert Taylor, executive director of the insurance industry's Council for Disability Awareness, who exclaims "The general health of the work force is declining". As the population becomes less active and ages, there will be more assistance needed for employers to help make modifications and adjustments for workers returning to their jobs after acquiring chronic illnesses or disabilities.
