



In Guilford County, Master Gardeners created a half-acre garden for the hungry as well as 35 adjacent community gardens. Produce grown in the gardens is delivered to a local food pantry.

#### THE NORTH CAROLINA MASTER GARDENERS' ENDOW-

MENT will enable friends of the Master Gardener program to provide financial support that will continue excellence in county and state programs. This endowment will provide funds on an annual basis to support a number of program needs, including new print materials and training manuals, Web sites, presentations, lesson plans and pilot projects.

For nearly 30 years, North Carolina Cooperative Extension has provided support to Master Gardeners in 87 counties from Murphy to Manteo.



The North Carolina Master Gardeners' Endowment is a fund that will be held in perpetuity so that it can be invested. Only the investment income from the account will be utilized to provide programmatic funding on an annual basis. An advisory board called "Friends of the North Carolina Masters Gardeners" will accept proposals and make recommendations on the use of the annual funds. The endowment will be housed in and managed by the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service Foundation, an entity of the North Carolina Agricultural Foundation, Inc. All contributions are tax-deductible and will be utilized solely for the Master Gardener program. *Sentence here about picutre*.



In North Carolina, there are more than 4,000 Master Gardener volunteers in 87 counties – and growing!

Under the guidance of Extension agents, Master Gardener volunteers must complete a training program, pass an examination and contribute a minimum of 40 hours per year (20 hours in subsequent years) through the local Cooperative Extension center.

Master Gardener volunteers conduct plant clinics, construct demonstration gardens and talk with community groups, among many other activities.

# By the Numbers

IN 2006, NORTH CAROLINA MASTER GARDENERS ...

- ... logged more than 190,000 volunteer hours, at a value of \$3.8 million
- ... participated in more than 1,500 educational exhibits reaching a half-million people
- ... delivered nearly 2,000 programs to groups across the state
- ... conducted nearly 500 school programs, reaching about 22,000 youth
- ... helped build 250 demonstration gardens and 97 school gardens
