PURPOSE: To inform Bureau staff of National Apprenticeship and Training Standards registered for Australia-New Zealand Direct Line.

BACKGROUND: These Standards were developed by ATR Nathaniel Brown, Ontario, California. They were registered February 21. ANZDL is a training effort which combines classroom instruction with on-the-job learning focused on the international trade and transportation industry. The occupation, **Transportation Clerk**, was approved as apprenticeable in July 1993. (See Bulletin 93-15.)

ANZDL's apprenticeship program provides familiarization with general practices of international trade and teaches apprentices about specific processes involved in the movement of cargo internationally.

The company has four sites: Chicago, Philadelphia, Houston, and Long Beach. The apprenticeship program is being initiated at the Long Beach site.

Because of its unique situation, the program is being registered at the National Office.

ACTION: All servicing of this program will be the responsibility of the Regional Director, Region IX. The Regional Director shall assign the program to the workload of a Bureau Apprenticeship and Training Representative (ATR), who will enter the program into AIMS. The National Office is to be advised immediately of the AIMS Program Number.

The ATR will register all apprentice actions under the terms of the National Standards regardless of training location, and provide service and assistance to the program director.

This Circular is effective immediately.
