Ross C. Brownson, Ph.D. is professor of epidemiology and chair of the Department of Community Health at St. Louis University School of Public Health in Missouri. He is the principal investigator of a CDC-funded Prevention Research Center that is developing innovative approaches to chronic disease prevention in high-risk communities. He is a member of numerous editorial boards and is associate editor of the *Annual Review of Public Health*. Dr. Brownson is the author or editor of five books including: *Chronic Disease Epidemiology and Control, Applied Epidemiology*, and *Evidence-Based Public Health*. He was formerly a division director with the Missouri Department of Health.
