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DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

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3. will inform USFDA within two working days of any effort made to obtain USFDA-provided non-public information from Health Canada by judicial or legislative mandate. If such judicial or legislative mandate orders disclosure of USFDA-provided non-public information, Health Canada will take all measures in an effort to ensure that the information will be disclosed in a manner that protects the information from public disclosure; and
4. will promptly inform USFDA of any changes to Canadian laws, or Health Canada policies or procedures, that would affect Health Canada's ability to honor the agreements in this document.
